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

ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA CAMPUSES

UNIVERSITY GOVERNANCE

The university is a part of the Oklahoma State System of Higher Education, which is composed of all higher education institutions supported wholly or in part by state appropriations. The Oklahoma Regents for Higher Education is the coordinating board for the system.

The university — as part of the public educational system of the state, established by legislative action and supported by annual legislative appropriations — places emphasis on sound scholarship, good citizenship, and the duties of the individual to the community and the commonwealth.

By constitutional enactment, the governance of the university is vested in the OU Board of Regents, a board consisting of seven members appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the State Senate. Each member is appointed to serve for seven years, except when appointed to fill an unexpired term, and is subject to removal from office only as provided by law for the removal of officers not liable to impeachment.

The Oklahoma Regents and the university regents approve the requirements for admission and graduation, the degrees offered, and the fees and expenses. The boards reserve the right to change these requirements.

NORMAN CAMPUS

The central campus and the offices of administration of the University of Oklahoma are located on some 3,500 acres in Norman, a city of more than 100,000 residents. Norman is located near the center of the state, 20 miles south of Oklahoma City, the state capital.

The colleges housed on the Norman campus are University College, the College of Architecture, the College of Arts and Sciences, the College of Atmospheric and Geographic Sciences, the Michael F. Price College of Business, the Mewbourne College of Earth and Energy, the College of Education, the College of Engineering, the Weitzenhoffer Family College of Fine Arts, the Graduate College, the Honors College, the Gaylord College of Journalism and Mass Communication, the College of Law, and the College of Liberal Studies. The Norman campus is also headquarters for the College of Continuing Education, which directs outreach programs throughout the state and around the world.

The Norman campus consists of four sections -- central campus, south campus, research campus and north campus. Most of the academic and administrative buildings are located on the central campus, noted for its Cherokee Gothic architecture and award-winning landscaping. Also situated on the central campus are the university residence halls; Sarkeys Energy Center; University Libraries; Fred Jones Jr. Museum of Art; Catlett Music Center, including Sharp Concert Hall and Pitman Recital Hall; Oklahoma Memorial Union; recreational facilities, including the Huston Huffman Physical Fitness Center and the Murray Case Sells Swim Complex; Gaylord Family -- Oklahoma Memorial Stadium; the Everest Indoor Training Center; and the Oklahoma Center for Continuing Education, a year-round educational center and conference site. Located one block east of the central campus is the OU Brandt Park and the Duck Pond, a recreational area used throughout the year by OU students and Norman residents. David A. Burr Park is conveniently located near residence halls and other recreational facilities.

South Campus

Immediately adjacent to central campus is the south campus, site of the Law Center and OU Foundation; the University apartments; the world-class Sam Noble Oklahoma Museum of Natural History; Lloyd Noble Center and parking complex; the John Crain Field at the OU Soccer Complex; the Headington Family Tennis Center; the Jimmie Austin University of Oklahoma Golf Course; L. Dale Mitchell Baseball Park; the Marita Hines Fields – OU Women's Softball Complex; the Sam Viersen Gymnastics Center; and OUr Children's World Learning Center.

Research Campus

OU's new 271-acre Research Campus is anchored by the Stephenson Research and Technology Center, where cutting-edge research into life science fields ranging from robotics to genomic studies is taking place, and the National Weather Center, a 244,000-square-foot facility opened in August 2006. This facility houses the National Weather Center programs, a confederation of state and federal organizations that work together on educational, pure and applied research, and operational activities along with the University of Oklahoma components of the Weather Center including the: School of Meteorology, Cooperative Institute for Mescoscale Meteorological Studies, Center for Analysis and Prediction of Storms, Environmental Verification and Analysis Center, Sasaki Applied Meteorology Research Institute, and Oklahoma Climatological Survey. The federal agencies that are part of the Weather Center include: the National Severe Storms Laboratory, Storm Prediction Center, National Weather Service Office (Oklahoma City), WSR-88D (NEXRAD) Radar Operations Center, and Warning Decision Training Branch. OU's Research Campus has been

certified by the Oklahoma Department of Commerce as Site Ready, which enables the university to capitalize on fast-moving economic opportunities and enables site selectors to readily find quality land and facilities that meet nationally established criteria in a timely fashion.

North Campus

North campus, which is two miles north of the main campus, includes the Merrick Computer Center; Max Westheimer Airport, the University-operated airport that also serves the City of Norman; and Swearingen Research Park, where government agencies and industry have established facilities. Other research and study units of the university include the Biological Station on Lake Texoma; the Sutton Avian Research Center in Bartlesville; the Oklahoma Geophysical Observatory at Leonard near Tulsa; the Aquatic Biology Fisheries Research Center in Noble near Norman; and the Oklahoma Biological Survey, the Oklahoma Archaeological Survey and Charles M. Russell Center for the Study of Art of the American West in Norman. In addition, the Oklahoma Geological Survey is a separate state agency located on the Norman campus and responsible to the University of Oklahoma Regents.

HEALTH SCIENCES CENTER

The University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center is the state's major educational resource for training physicians, dentists, nurses, pharmacists, public health specialists and a wide range of allied health personnel. The center is composed of the College of Allied Health, College of Dentistry, College of Medicine, College of Nursing, College of Pharmacy, College of Public Health and Graduate College.

Faculty and students use the clinical, laboratory and teaching facilities at the OU Medical Center, Veterans Administration Medical Center, The Children's Hospital at OU Medical Center, Presbyterian Hospital, Dean A. McGee Eye Institute, Oklahoma State Department of Health, Oklahoma Medical Research Foundation, other affiliated hospitals in Oklahoma City, the major teaching hospitals in Tulsa, the Veterans Administration Hospital in Muskogee and various affiliated hospitals and clinics in other locations in Oklahoma. The OU Health Sciences Center is the educational core of a group of 28 public and private health care institutions that make up the Oklahoma Health Center.

Also housed at the University of Oklahoma is OU Physicians, the state's largest physician group. The practice encompasses nearly every adult and child specialty. Many OU Physicians have expertise in the management of complex conditions. Such expertise is unavailable anywhere else in the state, region or sometimes even the nation. Some have pioneered surgical procedures or innovations in patient care that are world firsts. They also serve as faculty at the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine and train the region's future physicians.

OU-TULSA SCHUSTERMAN CENTER

The OU-Tulsa Schusterman Center is located in the heart of mid-town Tulsa at 41st and Yale. On this campus both the OU Health Sciences Center and the OU Norman Campus offer programs. The vision of OU-Tulsa is to build a nationally-recognized center of higher education excellence in select areas that emphasize the strong campus-community partnerships and that leverage the unique opportunities and needs in the Tulsa region.

Although OU's presence in Tulsa has been longstanding, it changed dramatically in 1999. As a result of the transformational \$10 million gift from the Charles and Lynn Schusterman Family Foundation and the leadership of President David L. Boren, OU was able to purchase 60 acres at the corner of 41st and Yale, previously the BP-Amoco Research Center. The OU programs in Tulsa had been located in a wide variety of physical locations. By the fall of 2002, all OU academic programs in Tulsa were located at the Schusterman Center campus. This campus has allowed OU to better serve the community by providing a strong, centralized identity in Tulsa. COLLEGE OF CONTINUING EDUCATION

The College of Continuing Education provides academic outreach opportunities to the state, region and nation. As the administrative unit for outreach at the University of Oklahoma, continuing education programs are the means by which the university extends its resources to the people of Oklahoma and beyond. By encompassing comprehensive, multidisciplinary academic services and programs that focus on the needs of adult learners, the College of Continuing Education offers both credit and non-credit courses, seminars, workshops, conferences, correspondence study, public service activities, and travel/study programs. 1890	On December 19, Territorial Governor Steele approved bills for the location of three territorial schools: the university at Norman, the agricultural and mechanical school at Stillwater, and a normal school at Edmond.

OU was selected as the site for the new Storm Prediction Center by the National Weather Service to provide short-term hazardous weather guidance for the continental U.S.

1996 Honors College established.

OU Health Sciences Center's Oklahoma Telemedicine Network, a major medical communications system, was dedicated.

International Programs Center established. Edward J. Perkins, former U.S. ambassador to Australia. became the center's first director.

The OU Fred Jones Jr. Museum of Art acquired the Fleishchaker Art Collection, which includes more than 400 major works by notable artists.

OU initiated the Faculty-in-Residence Program, in which faculty members live in student residence halls to create a sense of family and community on campus.

The Presidential Professors program was established to reward both senior and junior faculty who excel in teaching and research.

A new program, "OU Cousins," was established to help form friendships between volunteer American students and international students.

An \$18 million endowment to OU's College of Business by alumnus Michael F. Price was the largest gift to a public university and the third largest gift to higher education in the U.S. that year. In honor of his contributions, the college was named after Price.

The International Programs Center served as host for the first Foreign Policy Conference.

1998 A \$5 million gift by alumnus and Broadway producer A. Max Weitzenhoffer and his family benefited the Musical Theatre Program, which OU Regents named in his honor.

The Great Reading Room in Bizzell Memorial Library was named in honor of Peggy V. Helmerich.

1998 The Morris R. Pitman family made a \$700,000 gift to endow the gardens of OU's south oval.

The 105,000-square-foot, four-story Stanton L. Young Biomedical Research Center opened at the OU Health Sciences Center.

The first University Vice President for Technology Development named and the Office of Technology Transfer was created.

Department of Dance became the School of Dance.

1999 OU/OSU Research and Graduate Education Center in Tulsa was officially opened.

Ken Lackey was named OU-Tulsa's first president.

The Charles M. Russell Center for the Study of Art of the American West was dedicated.

The Prentice Gautt Academic Center, located in Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, was dedicated.

The Health Sciences Center and Norman campus of OU teamed up with the Oklahoma Medical Research Foundation to form a new Bioengineering Center.

The Donald W. Reynolds Foundation made an \$11.2 million gift for geriatric research and education at the OU Health Sciences Center.

The Schusterman Family Foundation of Tulsa made a grant to establish a new campus for the OU Health Sciences Center-Tulsa, which was named the Schusterman Health Sciences Center at OU-Tulsa.

2000 The Sam Noble Oklahoma Museum of Natural History opened to the public. The 195,000-square-foot museum features thousands of artifacts selected from millions in its collections.

The School of Petroleum and Geological Engineering was renamed in honor of Curtis W. Mewbourne.

The School of Journalism and Mass Communication was elevated to college status. The college was named in honor of the Edward L. Gaylord publishing family of Oklahoma City, who made a \$22 million gift to the college.

Through a bequest by the late Clara Weitzenhoffer, OU received the most important gift of French Impressionist art ever made to a public university and the largest gift to a public university in Oklahoma history. The Clara and Aaron Weitzenhoffer Collection comprises 33 works of art by such artists as Degas, Gauguin, Monet, Pissarro, Renoir, Toulouse-Latrec, Van Gogh and Vuillard.

OU's five-year Reach for Excellence Campaign concluded after raising \$514 million in private gifts, more than double the original goal of \$200 million and ranking OU's as the fourth most successful campaign among those completed by U.S. public universities.

First OU academic occupant, College of Pharmacy, moved into the Schusterman Center in Tulsa.

2001 The School of International and Area Studies was created.

The A. Max Weitzenhoffer Department of Musical Theatre was awarded department status.

The Health Sciences Center established a general clinical research center to provide treatment in an environment that assures maximum patient safety and enhancement of Oklahoma's biomedical research infrastructure to enable scientists from across the state to use the human genome data as well as new imaging technologies to study human diseases.

A state-of-the-art practice facility for OU Physicians, the OU Physicians Building, was completed.

The Schusterman Center, headquarters for OU-Tulsa area programs, was formally dedicated.

Ken Levit named OU-Tulsa's second president.

2002 All OU programs in Tulsa moved to the Schusterman Center.

Edward L. Gaylord, on behalf of the Gaylord family of Oklahoma City, presented a \$12 million gift to OU to complete the \$75 million expansion and restoration of Oklahoma Memorial Stadium. In recognition the stadium was named the Gaylord Family Oklahoma Memorial Stadium.

To promote reading and improve academic achievement, OU's Athletics Department and University Libraries formed a partnership to establish a \$1 million endowment by making a leadership gift of \$250,000 toward the endowment, using royalties derived from the sale of athletics merchandise.

The Henderson-Tolson Cultural Center, honoring George Henderson and Melvin B. Tolson Jr., two of OU's most outstanding black faculty, was dedicated.

OU held the 75th Anniversary Celebration of the Western History Collections, a collection of materials relating to the history of Oklahoma, the American Southwest, the American westward expansion and the history of American Indians in the American West.

Some 2,000 different Bibles, many notable and rare, and auxiliary and specialized studies about the Bible were given to the OU Libraries, complementing the Libraries' world-renowned William Bizzell Bible Collection of 665 Bibles and related works.

Rare books, antique doctors' bags, medical instruments and microscopes filled the History of Medicine Collection as it opened its doors in its new home in the Robert M. Bird Health Sciences Library.

BP America donated earth core samples, valued at more than \$2.5 million, from oil and gas wells and a \$3 million grant for implementation of the Oklahoma Petroleum Information System.

OU was selected as one of seven public and private research/doctoral institutions to receive the 2002 Circle of Excellence in Educational Fund Raising Award from the Council for Advancement and Support of Education.

2003 Fourteen new endowed faculty positions were created with FY2003 gifts.

President David L. Boren initiated the Sooner Heritage Scholarships Campaign to assist students and their families in absorbing an increase in tuition and fees.

A \$10 million grant from the Schusterman Family Foundation enabled construction of a Multipurpose Educational Facility at OU-Tulsa.

Groundbreaking was held for the OU-Tulsa Research and Medical Clinic at the Schusterman Center.

The Thams Collection of Southwestern art by members of the famous Taos Society of Artists, also known as the Taos Colony, opened to the public at the Fred Jones Jr. Museum of Art.

The National Science Foundation awarded OU a five-year Information Technology Research Grant to improve the detection and prediction of high impact local weather. OU was named a primary partner in the Engineering Research Center for Collaborative Adaptive Sensing of the Atmosphere, a center to improve forecasts and warnings. A \$10 million grant was awarded to the OU College of Dentistry to advance research in all areas of oral health.

The first student housing facility at the OU Health Sciences Center, University Village Apartments, opened.

2003 The new Dermatology Surgery Center opened at OU Physicians Dermatology in Oklahoma City.

The Board of Regents recognized David L. Boren, President, and Molly Shi Boren by naming the Honors College building David L. Boren Hall, the Health Sciences Center student center the David L. Boren Student Union and a street at Tulsa's Schusterman Center David L. Boren Blvd. To honor Mrs. Boren, a courtyard and shade garden at the Health Sciences Center was named the Molly Shi Boren Courtyard and the ballroom in Oklahoma Memorial Union was named the Molly Shi Boren Ballroom.

The OU College of Fine Arts was named the Weitzenhoffer Family College of Fine Arts after a family with a long history of supporting the university.

Gaylord Hall, a state-of-the-art media education facility for the Gaylord College of Journalism and Mass Communication, was dedicated.

A \$1 million grant from the Inasmuch Foundation of Oklahoma City enabled OU to launch the Edith Kinney Gaylord Expository Writing Program, the first program at a public university modeled on Harvard University's Expository Writing Program.

OU's Fred Jones Jr. Museum of Art received half of the prestigious R.E. Mansfield collection of Native American art, which includes ceramics, paintings, beadwork, sculpture and textiles, with the balance going to the Smithsonian.

The university celebrated the reopening of a newly remodeled Huston Huffman Physical Fitness Center, voted for and paid for by student funds.

OU opened One Partners Place, space designated to foster collaborations with private companies on the Research Campus. The U.S. Operations Center of Weathernews Inc., the world's largest publicly traded, full-service weather facility, is housed in half of the facility.

OU crossed the \$200 million mark in research and funding for externally sponsored programs.

The 34,000-square-foot Mary and Howard Lester Wing of the Fred Jones Jr. Museum of Art was dedicated in January. Among the major gifts received by the art museum in 2005 were the Tate Collection of 12 masterworks by members of the Taos Society of Artists donated by Priscilla C. and Joseph N. Tate of Tulsa, and 11 significant works of art bequeathed by the late Jerome M. Westheimer Sr. of Ardmore.

The Donald W. Reynolds Performing Arts Center was dedicated in April.

President David L. Boren launched the \$50 million Campaign for Scholarships, largest in OU history.

The Michael F. Price Hall for the Price College of Business was dedicated in September.

The College of Earth and Energy was formed from the Mewbourne School of Petroleum and Geological Engineering, School of Geology and Geophysics, Sarkeys Energy Center institutes and programs and the Oklahoma Geological Survey.

The College of Geosciences was renamed the College of Atmospheric and Geographic Sciences, with the School of Meteorology and Department of Geography and their related units.

The Oklahoma Climatological Survey celebrated 25 years of service to Oklahomans.

University Libraries received nearly \$2 million from the estate of Faery and Theodore Loveridge of Norman.

Exxon Mobil Corp. made a \$5 million gift in November for a world-class engineering practice facility, to be named the ExxonMobil Lawrence G. Rawl Engineering Practice Facility in honor of the late OU graduate and former Exxon Corp. chairman and CEO.

Information Technology deployed a new supercomputer from Dell, named Topdawg, which debuted as the 54th fastest supercomputer in the world, the fourth fastest among U.S. universities (excluding the National Science Foundation's "big three" national centers), and the biggest and fastest in the Big 12 and in the history of the state of Oklahoma.

The Campaign for Scholarships reached the \$50 million goal in one year, prompting a decision to raise the goal to \$100 million and extend the campaign for three years.

A longtime Ardmore accountant, who insisted on anonymity for the gifts he made to OU during his lifetime, left the university the largest estate gift in its history. The estate gift of David C. Steed, a lifelong Ardmore resident totaled more than \$9 million. The School of Accounting was named the John T. Steed School of Accounting in honor of David Steed's father, who established the Steed accounting firm in 1924.

In FY2006, 26 new endowed positions were added bringing the total endowed positions to 406.

OU received an academic excellence grant from the OU Foundation for \$2.7 million, with the grant to be recurring each year.

Dr. Gerry Clancy, dean of the OU College of Medicine, Tulsa, was named OU-Tulsa president.

The University of Pennsylvania donated a historically important M.P. Möller pipe organ (Op. 5819) to the newly organized American Organ Institute at OU. It is to be installed in Catlett Music Center's Paul F. Sharp Concert Hall.

University-wide Research Cabinet is created to coordinate research planning on all three OU campuses.

The National Weather Center – a unique partnership of OU and the U.S. National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's Norman-based weather research and operations programs – opened its new facility.

The university's royalty and license income derived from its technologies surpassed \$10 million.

OU was named a Confucius Institute site. The institute was established to promote and develop Chinese language education, and cultural and business exchange with the People's Republic of China.

The Department of Emergency Medicine, a residency program in Emergency Medicine and the Oklahoma Institute for Disaster and Emergency Medicine at the OU College of Medicine, Tulsa, was established.

Groundbreaking was held for the OU Cancer Institute at OU Health Sciences Center. With a \$165 million investment in the first phase of the institute, it is one of the largest public-private partnerships ever undertaken in Oklahoma.

The Chickasaw and Choctaw nations became important partners of the university's fight against diabetes, committing funds for the creation of endowed faculty positions in OU diabetes research and clinical care programs.

The number of endowed faculty positions increased to 445 in FY 2007.

FY 2007 was a record year for private fund raising, with gifts totaling \$138.5 million. OU's endowment topped \$1.1 billion, putting OU in a league of only a handful of other universities that have an endowment of more than \$1 billion.

A \$7.5 million grant from the Donald W. Reynolds Foundation was presented to OU to establish a new research program focusing on the diseases of aging. The grant built on an earlier grant from the Reynolds Foundation that helped position OU's geriatric medicine programs as one of the premier programs in the country.

The 122,000-square-foot Schusterman Clinic opened at the OU-Tulsa Schusterman Center, uniting many OU-Tulsa clinical programs under one roof.

Enid couple Harold and Sue Ann Hamm made a \$7 million gift through their foundation in support of the new Oklahoma Diabetes Center at the OU Health Sciences Center in Oklahoma City. A subsequent commitment from the Hamms increased this gift to \$10 million. The Diabetes Center will be named in honor of Mr. Hamm.

OU's Fred Jones Jr. Museum of Art and the Philbrook Museum of Art in Tulsa were jointly selected to receive the renowned Eugene B. Adkins collection of art. It is among the most important private collections in the nation of works by the Taos artists as well as Native American works of art.

The newest college at OU was renamed the Mewbourne College of Earth and Energy in recognition of the long-standing support and involvement of OU petroleum engineering alumnus Curtis Mewbourne of Tyler, Texas.

Construction began on a new building for the College of Allied Health. The project involves construction of a three-story building for the college and a Speech and Hearing Center.

OU purchased a mobile clinic unit, Sooner Schooner II, for use by the OU College of Medicine, Tulsa. The unit allowed the College of Medicine, Tulsa, in association with the State Department of Health, to increase health-care outreach to provide primary patient care to the underserved in northeastern Oklahoma as well as assist in emergency management response.

With the assistance of Oklahoma City civic leaders Aubrey K. McClendon and Clayton I. Bennett, OU added women's rowing to its intercollegiate athletics program. McClendon and Bennett worked with the Riverfront Redevelopment Authority and the OU Athletics Department on the addition of the sport and on private fund raising for a new boathouse to be constructed on the banks of the Oklahoma River.

Norman Campus Research and Information Technology Organizational Charts



Combined ACT/SAT Scores by College




























Space By Room Use









Distribution of Space by College and Administrative Unit Tulsa Campus






