

#### ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA CAMPUSES

#### **UNIVERSITY GOVERNANCE**

The university is a part of the Oklahoma State System of Higher Education, which is composed of all higher education institutions supported wholly or in part by state appropriations. The Oklahoma Regents for Higher Education is the coordinating board for the system.

The university — as part of the public educational system of the state, established by legislative action and supported by annual legislative appropriations — places emphasis on sound scholarship, good citizenship, and the duties of the individual to the community and the commonwealth.

By constitutional enactment, the governance of the university is vested in the OU Board of Regents, a board consisting of seven members appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the State Senate. Each member is appointed to serve for seven years, except when appointed to fill an unexpired term, and is subject to removal from office only as provided by law for the removal of officers not liable to impeachment.

The Oklahoma Regents and the university regents approve the requirements for admission and graduation, the degrees offered, and the fees and expenses. The boards reserve the right to change these requirements.

#### **NORMAN CAMPUS**

The central campus and the offices of administration of the University of Oklahoma are located on some 3,500 acres in Norman, a city of more than 100,000 residents. Norman is located near the center of the state, 20 miles south of Oklahoma City, the state capital.

The colleges housed on the Norman campus are University College, the College of Architecture, the College of Arts and Sciences, the College of Atmospheric and Geographic Sciences, the Michael F. Price College of Business, the Mewbourne College of Earth and Energy, the Jeannine Rainbolt College of Education, the College of Engineering, the Weitzenhoffer Family College of Fine Arts, the Graduate College, the Joe C. and Carole Kerr McClendon Honors College, the Gaylord College of Journalism and Mass Communication, the College of Law, and the College of Liberal Studies. The Norman campus is also headquarters for the College of Continuing Education, which directs outreach programs throughout the state and around the world.

The Norman campus consists of four sections -- central campus, south campus, research campus and north campus. Most of the academic and administrative buildings are located on the central campus, noted for its Cherokee Gothic architecture and award-winning landscaping. Also situated on the central campus are the university residence halls; Sarkeys Energy Center; University Libraries; Fred Jones Jr. Museum of Art; Catlett Music Center, including Sharp Concert Hall and Pitman Recital Hall; Oklahoma Memorial Union; recreational facilities, including the Huston Huffman Physical Fitness Center and the Murray Case Sells Swim Complex; Gaylord Family -- Oklahoma Memorial Stadium; the Everest Indoor Training Center; and the Oklahoma Center for Continuing Education, a year-round educational center and conference site. Located one block east of the central campus is the OU Brandt Park and Duck Pond, a recreational area used throughout the year by OU students and Norman residents. David A. Burr Park is conveniently located near residence halls and other recreational facilities.

#### **South Campus**

Immediately adjacent to central campus is the south campus, site of the Law Center and OU Foundation; the University apartments; the world-class Sam Noble Oklahoma Museum of Natural History; Lloyd Noble Center and parking complex; the John Crain Field at the OU Soccer Complex; the Headington Family Tennis Center; the Jimmie Austin University of Oklahoma Golf Course; L. Dale Mitchell Baseball Park; the Marita Hines Fields – OU Women's Softball Complex; the Sam Viersen Gymnastics Center; and OUr Children's World Learning Center.

#### **Research Campus**

OU's new 271-acre University Research Campus brings together academic, public, and private sector organizations in a mutually beneficial collaborative environment. It is anchored by the Stephenson Research and Technology Center, where cutting-edge research into life science fields ranging from robotics to genomic studies is taking place, and by the National Weather Center, a 244,000-square-foot facility that opened in August 2006 and that houses University educational and research facilities as well as federal operational forecasting, research and training facilities involving more than 550 people.

A series of "Partners Place" buildings house private sector and University organizations encompassing areas ranging from weather and hydrology to applied social research and geospatial information technologies. New to the Research Campus is a \$2.5 million commercial weather radar, OU-PRIME, to support research and education. Now under construction is the third Partners Place building that will bring together the Vice Presidents for Research, Technology Development, and the Chair and Chief Operating Officer of the OU Research Cabinet as well as house several private companies, and the Stephenson Life Sciences Research Center, comprising some 30 state of the art chemistry and biochemistry research labs.

Combined, more than 650,000 square feet will be available on the Research Campus when the two buildings now under construction are completed. In the planning phase are light industrial facilities and a fourth Partners Place building. OU's Research Campus has been certified by the Oklahoma Department of Commerce as Site Ready, which enables the university to capitalize on fast-moving economic opportunities and enables site selectors to readily find quality land and facilities that meet nationally established criteria in a timely fashion.

#### ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA CAMPUSES

#### **North Campus**

North campus, which is two miles north of the main campus, includes the Merrick Computer Center; Max Westheimer Airport, the University-operated airport that also serves the City of Norman; and Swearingen Research Park, where government agencies and industry have established facilities.

Other research and study units of the university include the Biological Station on Lake Texoma; the Sutton Avian Research Center in Bartlesville; the Oklahoma Geophysical Observatory at Leonard near Tulsa; the Aquatic Biology Fisheries Research Center in Noble near Norman; and the Oklahoma Biological Survey, the Oklahoma Archaeological Survey and Charles M. Russell Center for the Study of Art of the American West in Norman. In addition, the Oklahoma Geological Survey is a State Agency mandated in the Constitution of Oklahoma, and is part of the Mewbourne College of Earth and Energy at the University of Oklahoma.

#### **HEALTH SCIENCES CENTER**

The University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center is the state's major educational resource for training physicians, dentists, nurses, pharmacists, public health specialists and a wide range of allied health personnel. The center is composed of the College of Allied Health, College of Dentistry, College of Medicine, College of Nursing, College of Pharmacy, College of Public Health and Graduate College.

Faculty and students use the clinical, laboratory and teaching facilities at the OU Medical Center, Veterans Administration Medical Center, The Children's Hospital at OU Medical Center, Presbyterian Hospital, Dean A. McGee Eye Institute, Oklahoma Department of Health, Oklahoma Medical Research Foundation, other affiliated hospitals in Oklahoma City, the major teaching hospitals in Tulsa, the Veterans Administration Hospital in Muskogee and various affiliated hospitals and clinics in other locations in Oklahoma. The OU Health Sciences Center is composed of the Presbyterian Health Foundation Research Park and 30 other biomedical entities, including the OU Health Sciences Center as its centerpiece.

Also housed at the University of Oklahoma is OU Physicians, the state's largest physician group. The practice encompasses nearly every adult and child specialty. Many OU Physicians have expertise in the management of complex conditions. Such expertise is unavailable anywhere else in the state, region or sometimes even the nation. Some have pioneered surgical procedures or innovations in patient care that are world firsts. They also serve as faculty at the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine and train the region's future physicians.

#### **OU-TULSA SCHUSTERMAN CENTER**

The OU-Tulsa Schusterman Center is located in the heart of mid-town Tulsa at 41st and Yale. On this campus both the OU Health Sciences Center and the OU Norman Campus offer programs. The vision of OU-Tulsa is to build a nationally-recognized center of higher education excellence in select areas that emphasize the strong campus-community partnerships and that leverage the unique opportunities and needs in the Tulsa region.

OU has a long history in the Tulsa area. The earliest program of the University of Oklahoma in Tulsa started in 1957 as a partnership with the Tulsa-City County Library. This program averaged 50 students a year and was one of the first programs to be part of the Tulsa Graduate Center, which became University Center at Tulsa in 1982. Recognizing the potential community impact of an expansion of OU services in Tulsa, the Oklahoma Legislature enacted Senate Bill 453 in 1972 that created a clinical branch of the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine in Tulsa. Today, the OU College of Medicine enrolls 60 medical students in their third and fourth years and trains 181 residents who conduct 200,000 patient visits annually at the college's ambulatory clinics.

Although OU's presence in Tulsa has been longstanding, it changed dramatically in 1999. As a result of the transformational \$10 million gift from the Charles and Lynn Schusterman Family Foundation and the leadership of President David L. Boren, OU was able to purchase 60 acres at the corner of 41st and Yale, previously the BP-Amoco Research Center. The OU programs in Tulsa had been located in a wide variety of physical locations. By the fall of 2002, all OU academic programs in Tulsa were located at the Schusterman Center campus. This campus has allowed OU to better serve the community by providing a strong, centralized identity in Tulsa.

In February of 2008, the George Kaiser Family Foundation made a \$50 million gift to the OU College of Medicine in Tulsa allowing the College of medicine to have the explicit focus to improve the health status of underserved communities. To reflect that change, the name of the College of Medicine in Tulsa was changed to the OU School of Community Medicine, the first in the nation. The School of Community Medicine remains an integral part of the OU College of Medicine.

#### **COLLEGE OF CONTINUING EDUCATION**

The College of Continuing Education provides academic outreach opportunities to the state, region and nation. As the administrative unit for outreach at the University of Oklahoma, continuing education programs are the means by which the university extends its resources to the people of Oklahoma and beyond. By encompassing comprehensive, multidisciplinary academic services and programs that focus on the needs of adult learners, the College of Continuing Education offers both credit and non-credit courses, seminars, workshops, conferences, correspondence study, public service activities, and travel/study programs. The diversity and quality of the services available through continuing education programs provide an exciting and challenging academic experience.

Marking one of the largest renewable energy commitments ever by a public university in the United States, the OU Norman campus announced it would purchase 100 percent of its electricity from wind power by 2013 with the signing in September of a wind power agreement with Oklahoma Gas and Electric Co. OU also planned to expand its use of vehicles powered by compressed natural gas and announced it would open a new CNG refueling station at the new Transportation Operations Center.

OU had another record-shattering year for private fundraising, with a phenomenal \$273.3 million raised, including almost \$199.4 million in gifts received. Of the total, \$61 million was contributed by 80 donors to endowed chairs and faculty positions on all three campuses to take advantage of the end of the 1:1 state match on faculty endowments. The gifts completed the private support for 127 fully funded different faculty positions on all three campuses and added 20 new endowed chairs and professorships, bringing the total number of OU faculty endowments to 539.

Responding to a devastating ice storm in December 2007 that destroyed or damaged more than 1,000 trees on OU's campuses, members of the OU family responded rapidly and generously to a successful \$1.7 million Reforestation Campaign, headed by OU First Lady Molly Shi Boren. The centerpiece campaign gift was a \$500,000 grant made by OU Regent Jon R. Stuart and his wife, Dee Dee, through the Stuart Family Foundation. The Stuarts challenged OU donors and friends to match that amount, which they did within the first six weeks of the campaign. Thousands of OU students also participated in "Rake It Up," a tree debris cleanup event in January, and tree-planting activities during March's Arbor Week, providing the labor-cost equivalent of \$200,000.

Since it was launched in 2005, the Campaign for Scholarships had raised nearly \$137 million, including more than \$109 million in endowed gifts, pledges and deferred commitments.

OU was the first school in the Big 12 to offer a rebate based on grade-point averages for those students living on campus. The initiative, the OU Academic Success Rebate Program, was to reward academic excellence among upper-class and graduate students living in OU Traditions Square or the residence halls. The rebate was guaranteed to be given to high-performing students at the end of each semester on the basis of the student's GPA at the start of the semester.

The George Kaiser Family Foundation announced a \$50 million gift – the largest single gift ever to OU – to improve the health of Oklahomans through community-based medicine. With the gift, the College of Medicine at OU-Tulsa changed its focus and became the first formally named School of Community Medicine in the nation. The OU school's purpose is to improve the overall health status of underserved Oklahoma communities, both rural and urban, by providing additional community-based medical student education programs and resident training, and increasing the number of physician graduates.

OU received a \$12.5 million commitment from Aubrey K. McClendon and his wife, Kathleen B. McClendon in May to fund academic and athletics projects. Their donation benefited the Honors College and Debate Program, and it also funded two new major athletic capital projects: the OU Boathouse in Oklahoma City and a new housing facility for students and student-athletes. In recognition, OU Regents approved the naming of Honors College for Aubrey McClendon's parents, Joe C. McClendon (BBA '51) and Carole Kerr McClendon (BA '53). In addition, the OU Debate Program in the Honors College was named for Shannon T. Self (BBA '79), a longtime friend and colleague of Aubrey's and a founding director of Chesapeake Energy Corp.

The College of Education was formally named for Jeannine Rainbolt, a 1951 education alumna, making the college the first in OU's history to be named for a woman and forever linking Mrs. Rainbolt's name with the education and support of future teachers at her alma mater. Her husband, H.E. "Gene" Rainbolt, a longtime alumni leader, was joined by son, David, and daughter, Dr. Leslie Rainbolt-Forbes, an OU Regent, in making an exceptional gift to the college.

Groundbreaking ceremonies were held for the new addition to Collings Hall, home of the newly named Jeannine Rainbolt College of Education.

The Schusterman Learning Center, the first building at the Schusterman Center designed solely for student classrooms, study and social space, was dedicated.

The state Legislature and private donors committed \$20 million to OU-Tulsa to build a specialty clinic to address health disparities that vary dramatically by ZIP code in Tulsa. The 50,000-square-foot clinic, which will serve patients in north, east and west Tulsa, will focus only on specialty care, including the treatment of cancer, diabetes and heart disease.

University Libraries added its 5 millionth volume, continuing a commanding lead as the state's largest research library and claiming one of the top two spots in size among Big 12 libraries.

To streamline online processes for OU students, faculty and staff, OU launched the oZONE portal, the largest technological effort in its history.

The Oklahoma Geological Survey celebrated its Centennial.

1890 to Present

1890	On December 19, Territorial Governor Steele approved bills for the location of three territorial schools: the university at Norman, the agricultural and mechanical school at Stillwater, and a normal school at Edmond.
1891	First Board of Regents for the University of Oklahoma appointed by Governor Steele.
1892	David Ross Boyd, Superintendent of the Arkansas City, Kansas school system, became first president

of the University of Oklahoma.

On September 15, OU enrolled the first students. Of the 57 students who presented themselves for admission, not one qualified for freshman standing. Therefore, the university began its career as a preparatory school and continued as such for several years.

1893 First college freshman enrolled.

School of Pharmacy founded in response to demands for pharmacists in the territory.

First annual catalog published; four departments were advertised: Preparatory, Collegiate, Pharmaceutical, and Musical.

- 1894 Oklahoma Historical Society organized.
- 1896 First degree -- that of Pharmaceutical Chemist -- conferred.
- 1897 The first OU newspaper, *The Umpire*, began operations.
- 1898 First Bachelor of Arts degree conferred.

University created four new divisions: Graduate work, Premedical work, School of Music, and the Summer School.

First graduate students enrolled.

1899 Alumni Association organized.

Territorial legislature authorized creation of a department of Geology and Natural History, which later became the Geological Survey.

First honorary degree conferred.

1900 First Master of Arts degree conferred.

First medical instruction offered.

- 1901 Major elective system, with prescribed work in English, French, or German, biology or chemistry, and history was adopted by College of Arts and Sciences.
- 1902 School of Fine Arts established from School of Music.
- 1903 First Bachelor of Science degree conferred.

Funds donated by Andrew Carnegie for the construction of a university library.

1904 School of Applied Science with curricula in mechanical, electrical, and civil engineering established.

First Rhodes Scholar from OU chosen.

1905 Publication of the first OU yearbook, *The Mistletoe*, began.

First social fraternity (Kappa Alpha) chartered.








### ORGANIZATIONAL CHART



Combined ACT/SAT Scores by College










#### Retention and Graduation Rates












#### Total Recipients and Dollar Amounts


#### Space By Room Use










# Headcount Enrollment by Resident Status and Full-Time/Part-Time














