**Competitive Research: More than Maintenance utilizing New
Resources, Initiatives, and Directions**

Abstract

Dr. Alicia Knoedler will update the College of Engineering faculty on continuing to do more with their research programs through effective use of new resources and initiatives at OU as well as understanding some of the activities and directions that the University is pursuing. There will also be time to discuss increasing demands for pursuing research in the context of demands and pressures from other interests.

Biography

Dr. Alicia Knoedler is currently the Associate Vice President for Research and Director of the Center for Research Program Development and Enrichment at the University of Oklahoma. Within the Center, she works with faculty, students, and other investigators to significantly enhance the research enterprise, focusing on changing the research culture as well as assisting investigators in their efforts to develop more competitive research programs and proposals for external funding.

Dr. Knoedler received her B.A. in Psychology from Trinity University in San Antonio, Texas, and her M.S. and Ph.D. in Cognitive Psychology from Purdue University. Dr. Knoedler has taught quantitative research methodology, statistics, and grant writing for many years at Purdue University, San Jose State University, University of California Santa Cruz, Indiana University, University of Notre Dame, and Penn State University. Prior to joining OU in 2010, Dr. Knoedler specialized in assisting Penn State investigators across the university in the development of large, collaborative, and multidisciplinary grant proposals. She worked to identify high profile funding opportunities and match them with Penn State research strengths.
