Announcing Two New Courses for Fall Semester

We are happy to announce a new colloquium for the Fall. Honors 3993, "Search for the Ideal Community: From Plato to Waco," will meet on Tuesdays, 1:30 p.m. to 4:20 p.m. in Monnett 101. The instructor is Dr. Paul Sharp, Regents Professor of History and President Emeritus. This course investigates the concepts, social history, literacy and cultural background of some of the leading efforts to create "ideal" communities, particularly in the United States during the nineteenth century. The course received excellent reviews when it was taught by Dr. Sharp last year, and this is a good opportunity to take your required colloquium. Call or come by the Honors College office (1300 Asp Avenue until July 21 and Couch 2 East after July 21) for a pink card. We will issue pink cards on a first-come basis, regardless of classification. Remember to bring your ID!

Another opportunity for Honors credit is a one-hour credit (HON 2970, S/U graded) weekend course, "China Today," taught by Dr. Dunren Zhou from the Center for the American Studies, Fudan University, Shanghai, China. The class begins on Friday, September 11 at 6:00 p.m. and ends on Sunday, September 13 at 5:00 p.m. The professor of record is Dr. Gary Cohen, Director, International Academic Programs and Professor of History. The assigned textbook is *Rediscovering China: Dynamics and Dilemmas of Reform*, Li Cheng, Rowman & Littlefield (paperback). Pink cards are available at the Honors College.

1998-99 OSLEP Seminars

Honors Students are given credit for two hours of honors-designated coursework outside their major for each Oklahoma Scholar-Leadership Enrichment Program seminar they complete. OSLEP seminars are 2 credit hours, UNIV 4000, S/U graded. These seminars always receive high praise; honors students especially appreciate the personal contact with outstanding scholars from across the nation. Because seminars fill fast, students are urged to apply for the OSLEP seminars in late August or early September.

All seminars will be held on the OU Campus between the Tuesday and Saturday of the given week.

Ethics and Genetics: Issues at the Frontiers of Science and Technology

October 14 - 18, 1998

This seminar will explore a variety of ethical issues raised by advances in genetics and biotechnology.

Visiting Scholar: Thomas H. Murray, professor of biomedical ethics and director of the Center for Biomedical Ethics at Case Western Reserve University School of Medicine and presidential appointee to the National Bioethics Advisory Commission.

Women's Expressive Culture in the Modern American West

October 27 - 31, 1998

The 20th-century West is full of work created by American women in the performing and visual and literary arts. This seminar will help explain why we have not heard of

most of the Western women who created the expressive culture, how they created and marketed their works, and who were their audiences.

Visiting Scholar: Joan Jensen, emerita professor of history at New Mexico State University, where she was also director of the Women's Studies Program from 1989 to 1992.

The Search for Extra-Terrestrial Intelligence

November 11 - 15, 1998

This seminar will examine in some detail the factors that play a role in making the universe habitable and look at factors that make communication possible over interstellar distances, current and possible near-term searches for extraterrestrial technology, and the future science of advanced civilizations in our galaxy.

Visiting Scholar: Laurance R. Doyle, principal investigator, SETI Institute, NASA Ames Research Center, Moffett Field, California.

Politics in an Age of Media

January 6 - 10, 1999

This seminar will explore how American politics have changed in response to the growth of the mass media industries and consider such questions as these: Do the mass media advance or retard citizen involvement in political life? What are the political effects of such new phenomena as all-news television stations, the Internet and the World Wide Web, international news conglomerates, and--yes--"The X Files"?

Visiting Scholar: Roderick P. Hart, Liddell professor of communication and professor of government, University of Texas.

Slaves/Slavery in the American Imagination

March 17-21, 1999

This seminar goes back to slavery, the root of our racial problems, to examine ways in which enslaved people and the institution of slavery have been represented in American writing--autobiographical, biographical and fictional--searching for the crucial assumptions that still inform our discussions of race relations.

Visiting Scholar: Nell Irvin Painter, director of the Program in African-American Studies and Edwards professor of American history, Princeton University.

Protecting Human Health-- Government Regulation of Drugs and Tobacco

April 7-11, 1999

This seminar will address the regulation of drugs, tobacco and chemicals, including an examination of how regulatory decisions are made, how scientific data used in the risk-assessment process are obtained, how scientific data are interpreted, and how exposure assessment is conducted.

Visiting Scholar: David Kessler, dean of the Yale School of Medicine and commissioner of the U.S. Food and Drug Administration from 1990 to 1997

Edgar and Vu Named Goldwater Scholars

Two OU honors students, Eric Edgar and Ha T. Vu have been selected as 1998 Goldwater Scholars. The prestigious scholarships are awarded to college juniors and seniors who have outstanding potential and intend to pursue careers in mathematics, the natural sciences, or engineering.

Eric Edgar, a Tulsa, OK senior in Zoology, interned last summer with the Missouri Ozark Forest Ecosystem Project. There, he designed and conducted a field research project, and presented the results at an undergraduate symposium in his paper, "Does disturbance caused by human monitoring of ground nests affect depredation rates?" This summer, Edgar will research siblicide in cattle egrets with Dr. Douglas Mock, OU Professor of Zoology. Spielman holds a 4.0 gpa, and in addition to being a member of the OU Honors College, is also a National Merit Scholar, an Oklahoma Academic Scholar, an AP National Scholar, an Oklahoma Academic All-State Southwestern Bell Corp. Scholar, and a Rita H. Lottinville scholarship recipient. He plans to earn a PhD. in Zoology.

Ha T. Vu, an Orange, TX senior in Biochemistry/Pre-Medicine, has performed laboratory research work in human genomic sequencing studies. Last year, she began work with a graduate research student on sequencing DNA cosmid fragments spanning the DiGeorge Critical Region and Breakpoint Cluster Region in human chromosome 22. This summer, Vu will return for a second year to the University of Texas M.D. Anderson Cancer Center. Her research last summer resulted in co-authorship of four cancer research articles. Vu maintains a 4.0 gpa, and is an Award of Excellence recipient, a member of the Honors College, a Phillips Petroleum Scholar, a Rita H. Lottinville scholarship recipient, a College of Arts and Sciences Leadership Scholar, and an Academic All-Stater. She plans to pursue an M.D./Ph.D. in Molecular Hematology.

The national competition is conducted by the Barry M. Goldwater Scholarship and Excellence in Education Program. This year 1,186 applicants competed for 316 scholarships. The one and two year scholarships cover the cost of tuition, fees, books, and room and board up to \$7,500 per year.

News From the OU Speech Team

OU Speech and Debate spent the last year successfully rebuilding its team. After losing several team members to graduation in the 1997-98 school year, the team was able, through recruiting efforts, to replace the loss. This year's team was comprised almost entirely of freshmen and sophomores. Rising to the challenge, however, the team had a very successful year, placing high in many tournaments and taking second in the Oklahoma State Tournament. In addition, the young squad qualified four members competing in eight events for the American Forensic Association's National Individual Events Tournament (FA-NIET): Junior Chris Seiders, Sophomore Meredith Bates, and Freshmen Chris Smith and Jonathan Ray.

The team will begin the season under new Director of Forensics David Worth and new Assistant Director of Forensics, Thomas Bartl. In addition to competition, the squad will host a tournament for high school competitors as well as the nationally-popular "Sweetheart Swing" college tournament, co-hosted with West Texas A&M, and the District Qualifying tournament for the AFA-NIET.
