- Education (individual)

- Information and discussion of IPV/SV and additional topics that have been identified as individual/family educational needs

- Written Spanish/English materials that address IPV/SV and related identified individual/family educational needs

- referral services pg. 11

Support Groups

PCM page 13

- Provided on the 4th week of the month
 - Specific to male and female individuals
 - Open-ended
 - 60 to 90 minutes
 - No more than 20 individuals at one time
 - Male and/or female facilitator
 - Guest speakers upon request
 - Child care provided
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Outreach

PCM pages 7 & 15

- Establish contact with local clinics & hospitals, schools, churches, and agencies
 - Presentations to local Hispanic/Latino community:
 - risk factors that can lead to IPV/SV and information on IPV/SV
 - quarterly information on immigration, divorce and child custody issues
 - additional agency & service provider representatives included bi-yearly
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Proposed methods to Education

Increase knowledge & change attitudes,
beliefs, practices and behaviors

- Public Awareness
 - Training for professionals
 - Faith-based training on IPV/SV issues
 - Quarterly presentations on immigration,
divorce and child custody
 - Community events
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Public Awareness

Education page 14

- Newspaper articles focused on IPV/SV
 - Participation in health fairs with dissemination of IPV/SV information via flyers and pamphlets
 - Calendar development & distribution with information on home safety tips, domestic violence indicators, and family & community issues
 - Spanish/English media campaign, education & materials development, messages on IPV/SV displayed on billboards, benches and buses
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Public Awareness cont.

Education page 14

- Large banner displayed at Riverside Community Center for DV Awareness Month in conjunction with a community activity that addresses IPV/SV
 - Information dissemination on IPV/SV during DV Awareness Month
 - Spanish announcements to stop IPV/SV and a live presentation to include related issues at a local Spanish radio station along with newspaper articles & press release
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Training for professionals

Education page 14

- Hispanic/Latino cultural sensitivity to IPV/SV and immigration issues provided quarterly to local IPV/SV agencies and services, and the defense bar
 - A yearly training that will include issues relating to IPV/SV extended to a larger number of community agency and service providers
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Faith-Based Training on IPV/SV Issues

Education page 15

- IPV/SV staff will make presentations to local churches and clergy on IPV/SV
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Quarterly presentations on immigration, divorce and child custody

Education page 15

- Presented to Hispanic/Latino community
 - Held monthly, alternating each topic
 - Additional presentations held to include other agency and service provider representatives

- Held in Hispanic/Latino community at the Riverside Community Center
 - Domestic violence awareness month activity acknowledged with displayed banner
 - Activity addressing risk factors that can lead to IPV/SV and information on IPV/SV
 - Collaboration of activities with existing IPV/SV agencies and services
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Proposed methods to Collaboration

Enhance community infrastructure to improve coordination of services, activities and access to culturally sensitive services

- Maintain/increase representation on CBLC
 - Increase/establish access to services by Hispanic/ Latino community
 - Establish MOA's with participating agencies
 - Partner with agencies and services in training, education and service delivery
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Maintain and Increase CBLC Membership

Collaboration page 5 & 14

- On-going participation of CBLC members and sub-committees continue to concentrate on specific local IPV/SV needs
 - Collaborate with representatives from local OKC area educational services
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Increase/Establish access to services by the Hispanic/Latino community

Collaboration page 14 & 15

- Continued CBLC recommendation and endorsement of additional efforts to enhance existing educational services and activities
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Establish MOA's and partner with community agencies & services in training, education and service delivery
