DAVID EBERT, UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA

Dr. David Ebert is an Associate Vice President for Research and Partnerships, the interim Chief AI Officer, the Gallogly Chair Professor of electrical and computer engineering, and Director of the Data Institute for Societal Challenges (DISC) at the University of Oklahoma in Norman, OK. As Director of DISC, Dr. Ebert leads faculty and staff in creative innovations in data science, artificial intelligence (AI), machine learning (ML), and data-enabled research. His focus areas include foundational data science and data-enabled research related to aerospace, defense, and global security; community and societal transformation; the future of health; and environment, energy, and sustainability. Dr. Ebert also researches visual analytics, novel visualization techniques, interactive machine learning and explainable AI, human-computer teaming, and advanced predictive analytics. Dr. Ebert currently leads extensive research efforts applying AI/ML methods in predictive analytics for various funded projects to solve real world challenges.



JOHN CALLAWAY, CHOCTAW NATION OF OKLAHOMA

John Callaway is an Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS) pilot with an FAA Part 107 Remote Pilot Certificate and works for the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma Advanced Technology Initiatives department at the Emerging Aviation Technology Center (EATC). He has been flying sUAS (drones) since 2016, started his own drone business in 2018, and created one of the first public safety drone units in southern Oklahoma at the Buncombe Creek VFD on Lake Texoma in 2018. Initially flying for the fire department, he was soon in demand for his drone expertise and was called upon by Search & Rescue, Police, and Sheriff departments to assist in locating lost and missing persons, escaped prisoners and fugitives on the run, utilizing both visual and thermal camera systems. In addition, he has assisted regional first responders train for their Part 107 Certificate. John is also involved with STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) outreach for area students. John's current responsibilities with the Choctaw Nation include assisting UAS companies test drones, airspace deconfliction and safety mitigation. John also assists Choctaw Nation Emergency Management, local volunteer fire departments, and other Search & Rescue efforts.

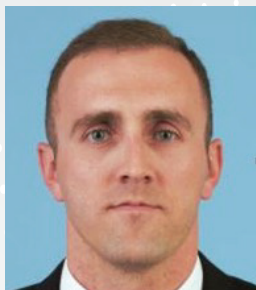


DALTON JACKSON, UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA

In 2020, SA Wiley transferred to the FBI's Oklahoma City Division (OC) where he joined the Joint Terrorism Task Force (JTTF). SA Wiley works a wide array of counterterrorism investigations but focuses primarily on international terrorism. SA Wiley's cases include investigations into terrorism financing, homegrown violent extremism (HVE), and foreign terrorism organization (FTO) activity in Oklahoma to include investigations into FTO's such as ISIS and Al-Qaida and their presence in Oklahoma.

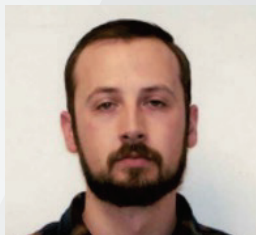


DANNY HAMILTON, FBI
