Spanish is the official language of 21 countries and it is the second most common language in international communication and business. In the United States, almost 43 million people speak Spanish. It is projected that by 2050, the United States will be the country with the largest number of Spanish speakers. Currently, there are 14 million students worldwide who choose Spanish as a second language.

OU students can receive OU credit for the Spanish major or minor for courses taken abroad in programs in universities in Argentina, Chile, Ecuador, Peru, and Spain. 


