GET OUTSIDE/TAKE BREAKS

It is important to remember to take breaks and step outside for some fresh air while preparing for finals. Spending time outdoors can have a positive impact on your mental well-being. Engaging in any form of physical activity can help alleviate stress. So hit the gym, do yoga, or take a 10-minute walk in between study sessions can help clear your mind and reduce stress levels.

STUDY SMARTER, NOT HARDER

Collaborative learning through study groups and study partners is an excellent method to assess your understanding. Strive to maintain concentration and steer clear of any diversions. One approach is to engage in quizzes with each other or adopt a divide-and-conquer strategy. For instance, your study group can divide the material into smaller sections and then instruct each other on the respective sections.



TEAM UP WITH STUDY BUDDIES

It might feel tempting to reread your entire textbook to cram for finals, but it won't work. In fact, it could backfire. Simply rereading material again and again does not do much to help retention.

Other techniques to avoid include one single cram session before the exam. Spacing out study sessions and focusing on more effective techniques like self-testing can help you study smarter, not harder study
