Grace Acan is a social worker and an advocate for the rights of survivors of conflict-related sexual violence (CRSV). Her book *Not Yet Sunset*, published in 2018, tells the story of her experience in war time. She is the co-founder of the Women's Advocacy Network Uganda (WAN), which brings together more than 900 war-affected women and men to advocate for justice, recognition, and accountability for sexual and gender-based violence. Grace is currently working with Refugee Law Project as an Archivist and she is also a Board member of the Global Survivors Fund, whose mission is to enhance access to reparations for survivors of conflict-related sexual violence. She is also a member of SEMA – the Global Network of Victims and Survivors to End Wartime Sexual Violence.
