NOTE: Consideration of admission is based upon satisfactory completion of the requirements listed below.

Please note that due to limited resources for this program, not all students who meet the minimum 3.25 GPA are admitted. Depending on the number of applicants and their GPA distributions, the minimum GPA required for consideration may not be competitive and does not guarantee admission.

ELIGIBILITY

- Students must have a minimum of 60 hours (junior standing) completed at the time of application and understand that they will have to complete all* coursework EXCEPT the 3 BPH-specific courses (PHCH 4106**, 4103, and 4113) prior to the semester they want to enter the BPH major.

**Students may only have 2-3 non-major courses (i.e. general education, minor courses, etc.) left to complete during or after their BPH semester. Students must have ALL major requirements (core, electives, and major support) completed, in-progress, or planned at the time of application. Students who plan to take both the BPH coursework and any remaining requirements via OU-Norman risk unavoidable course conflicts which can delay graduation. OU HSC and OU-Norman are not responsible for accommodating students with time conflicts in the spring semester they take BPH courses.*

***PHCH 4106 Experiential Learning in Public Health includes a practicum experience requiring 120 contact hours with a public health organization. In order to place students with desired organizations/projects, 2-3 meetings are required with College of Public Health admin during the Fall 2025 semester. Students are expected to prioritize these meetings in order to be successfully prepared to begin their practicums at the beginning of the Spring 2026 semester.*

- Students must complete ALL major coursework with a "C" or higher (including major support courses) prior to the semester they want to enter the BPH major. Students must have a minimum 3.25 GPA in both the OU Retention and Combined Retention GPAs for admission consideration.
- Applications will be evaluated and admission decisions made by July 1st, 2025
