<u>Demonstrate Ethical and Professional Behavior</u>



- Make ethical decisions by applying the standards of the National Association of Social Workers Code of Ethics, relevant laws and regulations, models for ethical decision making, ethical conduct of research, and additional codes of ethics within the profession as appropriate to the context.
- Use reflection and self-regulation to manage personal values and maintain professionalism in practice situations.
- Demonstrate professional behavior, appearance, and oral, written, and electronic communication.
- Use technology ethically and appropriately to facilitate practice outcomes.
- Use supervision and consultation to guide professional judgment and behavior.

Advance Access and Opportunities for All People



- Advocate for human rights at the individual, family, group, organizational, and community system levels.
- Engage in practices that advance human rights.

Engage in a Broad Representation of Varied Perspectives



- Demonstrate varied perspectives in social work practice at the individual, family, group, organizational, community, research, and policy levels.
- Demonstrate professional humility by applying reflection, self-awareness, and self-regulation, while acknowledging clients and constituencies as experts of their own lived experiences.
