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## Content Information

**Course Description and Prerequisites:** (Crosslisted with DSA 4413) Prerequisites: C S 2413 and C S 2813; or MATH 2513; or C S 5005. Design and analysis of algorithms and measurement of their complexity. This course introduces various algorithm design strategies: divide and conquer, greedy principle and dynamic programming to solve a variety of problems using algorithms of various types - deterministic and randomized, serial and parallel, centralized and decentralized, program based and circuit based.

**Learning Outcomes:** By the end of this course, students will be able to: produce a proof that a given algorithm is correct; identify an appropriate algorithm for an operation and argue its appropriateness in terms of runtime; calculate bounds on runtime for an algorithm; write pseudocode algorithms; implement algorithms in a programming language; apply algorithms to practical applications.

**Required Text:** "Introduction to Algorithms" (4th edition) by Cormen, Leiserson, Rivest, and Stein.

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## Grading

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## Attendance

It is important to attend class regularly and engage in the material. Quizzes will be conducted regularly in class for the purpose of encouraging active involvement with the material.

## Quizzes

Quizzes will be administered during many class days, without prior notice. Students should be prepared to answer questions based upon material discussed in class and/or requested readings. The purpose of the quizzes is to provide immediate formative assessment to inform both the instructor and the students of the student's current level of understanding. While most quizzes will be open-note, open-textbook, they will require quick responses.

We will primarily use Top Hat for our quizzes. Top Hat is a student response system (think "clickers") that we will use during most class periods. I will pose some sort of question (multiple choice, true/false, numerical answer, etc.), and you will respond using the Top Hat app or the Top Hat website. You will want to bring your cellphone or laptop to class for this purpose. Occasional paper quizzes will also be given.

## Interview Preparation

Many of the skills we will be developing in this course are features of a technical interview, in which you must put the algorithms and algorithm analysis we'll learn to practice. Points in this category will be determined by a range of activities which you may pick and choose from including solutions to leetcode problems, running time analysis of solutions, and mock interviews. ## Exams

There will be one midterm, in addition to a cumulative final exam. The exam will take place in class, October 14. Should we need to deviate from this schedule to better serve the goals of the course, students will be notified in advance. The cumulative final exam will be, as officially scheduled, December 18 from 8:00-10:00 AM.

Exams, taken during the scheduled time, will be graded as follows. Scores will begin at 50. The remaining 50 points (out of 100) will be determined by students' responses to 5 questions, worth 10 points each. Should a student unexpectedly miss the scheduled midterm exam without prior approval, the midterm will be determined by the student's percentage out of 50, with scores beginning from 0. Grades will not typically be curved, and grade adjustments on a case-by-case basis will not be made (and so please do not ask).

Unless there are explicit instructions to the contrary, all work for the class will be entirely your own work. The use of work done by others without giving credit or having permission is considered plagiarism. A violation of these policies is an immediate and serious breach of the academic integrity policies of the University

## Emergency Protocol

During an emergency, there are official university **procedures** (<https://www.ou.edu/campusafety/policy-and-procedures>) that will maximize your safety.

**Severe Weather:** If you receive an OU Alert to seek refuge or hear a tornado siren that signals severe weather.

1. Lookfor severe weather refuge location maps located inside most OU buildings near the entrances.
2. Seekrefuge inside a building. Do not leave one building to seek shelter in another building that you deem safer. If outside, get into the nearest building.
3. Goto the building's severe weather refuge location. If you do not know where that is, go to the lowest level possible and seek refuge in an innermost room. Avoid outside doors and windows.
4. Get in, Get Down, Cover Up
5. Waitfor official notice to resume normal activities.

## The University of Oklahoma Active Threat Guidance

The University of Oklahoma embraces a Run, Hide, Fight strategy for active threats on campus. This strategy is well known, widely accepted, and proven to save lives. To receive emergency campus alerts, be sure to update your contact information and preferences in the account settings section at [one.ou.edu](http://one.ou.edu) (<http://one.ou.edu/>).

**RUN:** Running away from the threat is usually the best option. If it is safe to run, run as far away from the threat as possible. Call 911 when you are in a safe location and let them know from which OU campus you're calling from and location of active threat.

**HIDE:** If running is not practical, the next best option is to hide. Lock and barricade all doors; turn off all lights; turn down your phone's volume; search for improvised weapons; hide behind solid objects and walls; and hide yourself completely and stay quiet. Remain in place until law enforcement arrives. Be patient and remain hidden.

**FIGHT:** If you are unable to run or hide, the last best option is to fight. Have one or more improvised weapons with you and be prepared to attack. Attack them when they are least expecting it and hit them where it hurts most: the face (specifically eyes, nose, and ears), the throat, the diaphragm (solar plexus), and the groin.

## Fire Alarm/General Emergency

If you receive an OU Alert that there is danger inside or near the building, or the fire alarm inside the building activates:









1. *LEAVE* the building. Do not use the elevators.
2. *KNOW* at least two building exits
3. *ASSIST* those that may need help
4. *PROCEED* to the emergency assembly area
5. *ONCE safely outside, NOTIFY* first responders of anyone that may still be inside building due to mobility issues.
6. *WAIT* for official notice before attempting to re-enter the building.
