Simon Reid-Henry is a professor of historical and political geography and the director of the Institute for Humanities and Social Sciences at the Queen Mary University of London. His current work examines the fault lines of democracy at home and abroad and the political dynamics of international public finance. Reid-Henry is one of the original thinkers behind a new paradigm for international public finance that can better secure global public goods and protect the global commons. His critically acclaimed books include *Fidel and Che: A Revolutionary Friendship* (Sceptre, 2009), *The Cuban Cure* (University of Chicago Press, 2010), *The Political Origins of Inequality* (University of Chicago Press, 2015), and *Empire of Democracy* (Simon & Schuster/John Murrays, 2019).
