

A scholar who researches the history of childhood malnutrition, Ruis is the author of Eating to Learn, Learning to Eat: The Origins of School Lunch in the United States (Rutgers University Press, 2017). Ruis' research provides the vital historical contexts of longstanding social and political battles that prevent hungry students from obtaining nutritious food at school.
