CHOOSE A FORMAT

START SMALL

Start with small changes and use a variety of tools to engage students.

USE A SCRIPT

A script is a helpful way to guide your student through the meeting. Some great things to include on your script:

- Introductions
- Purpose of the meeting
- Review goals and progress
- Strengths/Limitations
- Supports needed
- Feedback
- Goals

STUDENT CENTERED

This meeting is a chance for your student to share what they need from their IEP. Encourage them to share what works best for them.

- Accommodations needed
- Supports needed
- What is not working
- Good Day Plan
- Goals

DON'T FORGET THE TRANSITION!

Use transition assessments to guide a transition plan that considers your students' strengths, preferences, interests and needs for postsecondary goals.
