


A New Look for an Old Tradition

Material Management successfully completed its first annual inventory count of the expanded warehouse in June 2025, counting 4.497 bins and resolvina discrepancies in just 2.5 days. The final results showed 92.42% quantity accuracy and 99.32% financial accuracy—exceeding expectations and reflecting a strong team effort.

The OU FM Policy Committee has been hard at work reviewing and refining our standing policies. As a committee, we conducted a comprehensive review of existing FM policies. Through this process, we identified several policies that were outdated, that no longer aligned with the current FM structure, or that were already covered under broader OU General Staff Policies. For the remaining policies, we engaged in thoughtful discussions evaluating their written intent against how they are applied in day-to-day operations. We also took the initiative to reach out to peer institutions, including other in-state universities and fellow SEC counterparts, to compare our policies and practices against.

Our main goal throughout this process is to ensure that FM policies support a safe, effective, and fair workplace environment for all. We are proud of the diligence and collaboration that has gone into this work and hope these efforts will positively contribute to the continued success and well-being of the FM community.

HR UPDATES



Accident Reporting

This year there has been an uptick in accidents and property damage in Facilities Management. As a reminder, every accident or property damage needs to be reported – regardless of the extent of the damage.

Examples of accidents or property damage include:

- Wind gust catches truck door and causes door hinges to be bent.
- Lawnmower kicks up debris that injures a bystander, vehicle, or building window
- OU vehicle to OU vehicle accident
- OU vehicle to non-OU vehicle accident
- OU vehicle hits building signage, wall, or other object causing damage to the object or OU vehicle.

For vehicular accidents: OU police must be called at the time of the accident so that an official report can be made.

Report accidents or property-incidents immediately to your supervisor. After, They should report the accident to Enterprise Risk Management and to me.

The accident and property-incidents damage Reporting procedure can be found on OU Facilities Management SharePoint page, under FM Documents-Department Procedures.

I encourage everyone to read this procedure and become familiar with it before an accident occurs so that you know the process.
