- Teach undergraduate courses and graduate seminars (3+2 load) to music majors.
- Advise MM theses and serve on MM and doctoral (DMA and PhD) committees, as needed.
- Collaborate with the theory area in all departmental activities, and serve on various committees as assigned by the Director of the OU School of Music.
- Teach courses in the undergraduate core curriculum, Analysis of Tonal Music (a graduate course), and one graduate seminar per year on a topic pertaining to the candidate's expertise.

- Earned Ph.D. in Music Theory or a Ph.D. in Musicology with a theory concentration.

- Record of scholarly accomplishments: publications and presentations at conferences.
- Evidence of teaching experience in music theory.
