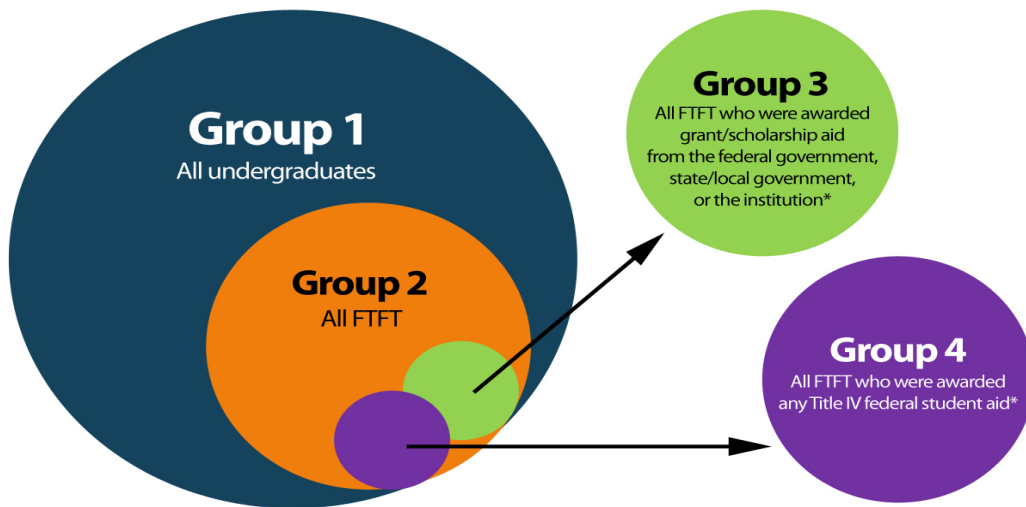

COA Revisions
