OKLAHOMA ROCKS A Day in the Life

In this lesson, students will use the research they gathered in the previous five lessons to put together a project reflecting a day in the life of a geologist. Students can create a PowerPoint, a video or write an essay compiling all your students have learned about their chosen geology career.

Objectives:

- **1.** Students will create a project using all the information gathered in previous lessons.
- Students can submit their projects to NIE for a chance to win a \$250 Visa gift card.

Student Activity:

In lesson one of this series students were asked to choose a career field to research. In lesson two they researched the education requirements for your chosen career. In lessons three and four students used the scientific method to design and conduct an experiment based on a problem that might occur in the field of their chosen career. Finally, in lesson five, students were coached on how to conduct an interview with a person in their chosen field of geoscience. Now students will take all the information they gathered and create a final project.

1. Instruct students to choose what type of final project they want to create.

- **a.** A PowerPoint presentation with details on all your research.
- **b.** A video explaining what you found in your research.
- c. A 2-3 page essay on your findings.
