  - International student resources
  - **(Speaker Absent from today's meeting)**
- GF25-17: "Conference/Research & Creative Exhibition Grant"
  - Moved to the floor by Senator Mondal (38), seconded by Senator Dulal (22)
  - This bill authorizes spending from the GSS account for graduate student travel and research grants. It includes student names, departments, award amounts, and summary statistics. A minor typo in one department was corrected; no changes to award amounts.
  - Chair: Any questions?
    - No questions
  - Motion to Approve via unanimous consent by Senator Hurst (59)
  - No objections. Bill Passes.

### Old Business:

- GF25-14: "SGA Compensation Alteration Delay Act" (Do Not Pass)
  - Chair: This is the bill previously seen, returned from Joint Committee with an added amendment specifying raises cannot be merit-based. Authors are present for presentation of the revisions and questions.
  - Cole (author): This is the same bill previously considered. The joint committee added Subsection A: "stipend changes must be based on position requirements, not merit" same bill will the added language "Any alteration to a stipend shall solely be based upon the requirements of the position itself, and the merits of the officer shall not be considered"
  - Questions:
    - Senator Jensen (3): Last session we indicated we were okay with merit-based raises. This bill doesn't address our concerns (the concerns of GSS). Why did the joint committee ignore those concerns and send back a version that contradicts what we voted for?
    - Cole: We discussed multiple amendments. This is the version that the joint committee concluded to present to both houses. It was not intended to override GSS
    - Senator Jensen (3): What compromise was actually made with GSS input?
    - Cole: Subsection A was added because GSS asked for clarification regarding merit-based raises. The joint committee determined raises should be procedural, tied to position requirements, not performance.
    - Senator Rivera (65): Does this bill still include the full election cycle delay before a stipend change takes effect?
    - Cole: Yes. The delayed implementation remains.
    - Senator Fullerton (2): If raises aren't merit-based, what are they based on? Is the delay necessary?
    - Cole: Raises would be based on cost of living or changes due to position duties. Delay prevents officers from voting on their own raises and avoids pulling funds from grants or student organizations mid-year. {Information fact check: salaries for paid student government positions and GSS grant/RSO funding are allocated from separate funding streams (Primary vs. auxiliary funding). GSS officers are not voting members in the student senate.}

- Senator Moreno-Ward (34): What if the workload increases unexpectedly? This seems to prevent extra compensated time?
- Cole: The code already defines expected office hours. Officers can exceed those hours if needed; they are not paid hourly. This bill does not change that.
- Senator Baskin (69) [questions from meeting chat] If the raises are for cost of living, and are brought to vote because of an increase in cost of living, why should we delay it for the current officer? Clearly if the cost of living is changing enough that we are raising stipends and salary, then the person currently holding the position deserves that same comfort given they are fulfilling the duties of their positions?
- Cole: I agree officer deserve raises. The issue is timing. If funds are allocated annually, immediate raises would require diverting money from graduate grants or student organization funding. {information fact check: graduate grants and student organization funding do not come from the same allocation funding streams and represent a difference in primary and auxiliary funding}
- Cole: (closing comment): I understand the body's stance. If anyone wants to collaborate on alternative legislation in the future, please reach out.
- Senator Geiszler (63) Motion for roll call vote, Seconded by Senator Romero (78)
- Voting Record: 4-53-0
- Bill does not pass.

#### **New Business:**

- GF25-16: "Native American Heritage Month Resolution of 2025" (Do Pass)
  - Motion to move to the floor by Senator Jensen (3), seconded by Senator Cunningham (82)
  - Lilith (author): This is a resolution to acknowledge that November is Native American Heritage Month, and here, especially at OU, we have, as of 2023, about 1,107 students registered within a tribal nation. I think it is really important to acknowledge that we have students, both graduate and undergraduate, who are registered as Native students, and we need to honor them especially with America's historical traumas that have been inflicted on Native tribes and the assimilation and boarding school that have occurred in the United States. I, myself, am Cherokee, and I think we should honor our Native students here and allow the bill to honor our students, both undergraduate and graduate. I yield my time.
  - Chair: Questions for the author?

  - Senator Jensen (3): Motion to pass via unanimous consent.
  - No objections. Bill passes.

An Act of Procedure approving Conference/Research  
& Creative Exhibition Grant awards  
for the 2025 Fall semester;  
providing for short title; stating purpose; and appropriations.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA GRADUATE STUDENT SENATE:

**Section 1:** The act shall be known and may be cited as an act of procedure approving  
conference/research & creative exhibition grant awards for the 2025 Fall semester.

**Section 2: PURPOSE.** The purpose of this act is to appropriate the funds of the University of Oklahoma  
Student Government Association to the individuals mentioned within.

**Section 3: APPROPRIATION.** The Graduate Student Senate shall allot Conference/Research &  
Creative Exhibition Grant awards for the 2025 Fall semester in the following manner:

CONGRESSIONAL BILL CB-114-13  
SENATE BILL NO. GF25-14

AS INTRODUCED

An Act of Legislation amending SGA Code Annotated  
§X.5 to create a provision preventing compensation  
alterations from taking into effect until regular election or  
appointment of certain positions has occurred; providing  
short title; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA STUDENT GOVERNMENT  
ASSOCIATION UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT CONGRESS:

Section 1: Title: This act shall be known and may be cited as the “SGA Compensation Alteration Delay Act”

Section 2: Purpose: The purpose of this act shall be to update Title X Chapter 5 of the Code Annotated to ensure that any alteration to the compensation of Undergraduate Student Congress officers, Graduate Student Senate officers, or any other elected or appointed committee Chair position shall not go in to effect until a regular election of the respective position shall have occurred. Any alteration to a stipend shall solely be based upon the requirements of the position itself, and the merits of the officer shall not be considered.

Section 3: AMENDATORY: The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association Code Annotated Title X Chapter 5 is amended as follows. For the purposes of this bill, all items removed shall be denoted with a strikethrough (~~strikethrough~~) and all items added shall be denoted with an underline (underline).

Section 4:

Chapter X-5 Salaries And Stipends

1. Positions Receiving a Salary/Stipend.

Section 1: The following positions shall receive a stipend:

- Campus Activities Council Chair: \$435/month
- Chair of Congress: \$435/month
- Chair of Senate: \$435/month
- Chair of SGA Budgetary Committee: \$350/month
- Secretary of Congress: \$350/month



- Secretary of Senate: \$350/month
- Student Bar Association President: \$350/month
- SGA President: \$520/month
- SGA Vice President: \$435/month
- Vice Chair of Congress: \$350/month
- Vice Chair of Senate: \$350/month
- Graduate Student Senate Ways and Means Chair: \$350/Fall Grant Cycle \$350/Spring Grant Cycle

The pay periods of the above positions will be designated as follows:

- Campus Activities Council Chair, Chair of Congress, Chair of Senate, Secretary of Congress, Secretary of Senate, Student Bar Association President, Vice Chair of Congress, and Vice Chair of Senate shall be compensated monthly with compensation periods beginning August 1st through the end of their term.
- The SGA President and SGA Vice President shall be compensated monthly with compensation periods beginning January 1st through the end of their term.
- The Chair of SGA Budgetary Committee shall be compensated monthly with compensation periods beginning the month of their appointment by the SGA Congress and ending with their term.
- The GSS Ways and Means Chair shall be compensated at the end of October and February, corresponding with the deadlines for the Fall and Spring grant deadlines.
- All SGA officers who receive a stipend or salary shall be eligible to receive compensation at their usual rates of pay during the summer, which shall consist of the months June, July. This pay will be given at the discretion of their staff advisor in Student Affairs, within the parameters of the budget. The SGA officers who receive a stipend shall only be eligible to receive such compensation while executing their official duties in the course of fulfilling their office hours.

Stipends are reflective of the weekly office hour requirement for each position. Stipends are based on performing the appropriate number of weekly office hours, as follows:

- All positions receiving \$520 per month are expected twelve office hours.
- All positions receiving \$435 per month are expected ten office hours.
- All positions receiving \$350 per month are expected eight office hours.

Section 2: The following positions shall receive a salary at a rate determined by their staff advisor in Student Affairs, with the consent of the SGA President, GSS Chair, and Congress Chair. These salaries will come from "The Office of Student Government and Organization Services" (SGOS) which will be allocated to in the salaries and stipends act of their term: two full-time staff, Associates of General Counsel, General Counsel, Chief of Staff, Election Commissioner, SGA Student Assistants.

The Chief of Staff shall be appointed by the SGA President following an open application process.

Any position not enumerated above shall not receive a salary/stipend.

- a. Student Parking Appeals Board Judges. The Student Parking Appeals Board Judges are appointed at minimum wage, but not funded by SGA; the positions are reimbursed through the Parking and Transit Office.

2. Suspension of Stipend. Any allegation regarding the fulfillment or lack of thereof of an officer's duty (provided there is some support for such allegation) is sufficient to bring that officer before the Student Activity Fee Reserve Committee. It is an issue of fact for the Committee to make their determination whether the officer's stipend should be suspended.
3. Other Employment. No employee in a SGA Stipend position shall be employed by the University of Oklahoma in a position that could be considered a conflict of interest. Neither shall they accept any special favors or privileges from any University employee or student or outside source which might in any way compromise their position and responsibilities while in office. This does not intend to include traditional or recognized academic and athletic compensation in the form of scholarships, fellowships, grants, of other similar aid, or employment, which clearly does not represent a conflict of interest. Notification of other employment shall be submitted to the office of the SGA General Counsel prior to elections for purpose of determining a conflict of interest.
4. Stipend Alteration Delay. Any alteration to a salary/stipend amount, enacted in accordance with the SGA Constitution and Code Annotated, that is applicable to one or more Undergraduate Student Congress officer(s), Graduate Student Senate officer(s), or any other elected or appointed committee Chair position, shall not go into effect until a regular election, or appointment of the respective position has occurred.
  - a. Any alteration to a stipend shall solely be based upon the requirements of the position itself, and the merits of the officer shall not be considered.

Section 5: This act shall become effective when passed in accordance with the SGA Constitution.

AS INTRODUCED

A Concurrent Resolution acknowledging the month of  
November as Native American Heritage Month; and  
providing for distribution.

- Whereas: Native American Heritage Month is celebrated during the month of November; and
- Whereas: Native American Heritage Month is used to promote and celebrate the cultural identities of Native Americans and Alaskan Natives; and
- Whereas: Native American Heritage Month is also used to educate the public on the challenges Native Tribes and people have faced throughout America's history; and
- Whereas: The United States federal government first recognized Native American Heritage Month in 1990<sup>1</sup>; and
- Whereas: Today about 7.4 million people are registered as Native American or Alaskan Native in the United States<sup>2</sup>; and
- Whereas: In 2023, about 6.79% of the population in Oklahoma were Native American, which equals to 271 thousand people<sup>3</sup>; and
- Whereas: As of 2023 at the University of Oklahoma there were 1,107 or 3.8% students who were registered as Native American<sup>4</sup>; and
- Whereas: The University of Oklahoma resides on the traditional homeland of the Caddo and Wichita nations. As well as being a part of the Apache, Comanche, Kiowa, and Osage nations<sup>5</sup>; and

Whereas:       Suppression, assimilation, and removal of Native Peoples and their culture were official policies by early state and federal settlement laws<sup>6</sup>; therefore

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT CONGRESS AND THE GRADUATE STUDENT SENATE, CONCURRING THEREIN THAT

- Section 1:**       Title: This resolution shall be known and may be cited as the “Native American Heritage Month Resolution of 2025.”
- Section 2:**       The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association shall recognize the month of November as Native American Heritage Month.
- Section 3:**       The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association shall recognize and honor the Native American students at The University of Oklahoma in addition to their culture and heritage.
- Section 4:**       The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association shall recognize and honor the University of Oklahoma resides on traditional Native American land.
- Section 5:**       The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association encourages the student body to participate in cultural appreciation events such as those planned by the American Indian Student Association in collaboration with other Native American and Alaskan Native Student Organizations on campus.
