Officer Reports -

- **Chair's Report:** Hello everyone I am so happy you are here. First of all we have a very special guest speaker with us today. Syed was talking to me about it and I just didn't know about all the things that happen, so please feel free to leave. We are not going to keep you here, we are not going to break for recess, you can leave, you can break your fast, you will be excused from the meeting. Please sign up for the Big Event. We only have seven people signed up so far. I know all of you guys are the most involved students on campus. Please sign up with Congress if you can. I'll resend the link in the GroupMe.
- **Vice Chair's Report:** Hi Everyone! I sent out an email earlier pertaining to CSP opportunities this month, as well as our first Professional Development workshop this semester, which will take place March 24th! That's all I got, thank you!
- **Secretary's Report:** Hi everyone, tonight we will be seeing an expulsion bill, I will talk more about that when we get to it.

Committee Reports-

- **Campus Outreach, Safety, and Concerns:** Hey everyone! COSCO met officially this Sunday. We went over project updates and finalized some details for our Cookies with Congress event coming up after spring break but before SGA elections in April. Also, today is the last day to fill out the Bizzell Memorial Library Hours survey so please do so if you haven't already; it closes tonight at midnight. Thank you to everyone who has already filled it out; we have gotten over 800 total responses. Lastly, COSCO will be holding its March light walk on Sunday, March 30th at 8:30PM. I know it's a bit late but sunset is right at 7:50 and we need it to be dark out for campus lights to be on.
- **Congressional Administration:** ConAd met officially this Sunday, and we gave CB-113-21 a Rec of Do Pass, the planned updated bill was sent by Hope so you should all have that. We also went over all of our projects and got a lot of great ideas and feedback. We are currently working on some bylaw changes to get everything updated.
- **External Affairs:** Hello everyone! EA met officially this past Sunday and we discussed our current projects. We largely discussed our spring civic engagement forum, which will be over the topic of minimum wage in Oklahoma. We have made some exciting developments there. We decided to move the forum to April 25th so we don't conflict with Easter Weekend. We have the pleasure of currently having James Rosencrantz an economist and political consultant Amber England to join us on our panel Don't Forget!!! Higher education day is now on April 15th!!! If you have not signed up for the new date yet please do so!!! The earlier we have a count of the number of people going the better. The link will be posted in the group me. I hope everyone is having a wonderful week!
- **Human Diversity:** HD met officially on Sunday. We followed up on our projects and bills. We followed up on the Black Emergency Response Team. We also had a meeting with ADRC to discuss accommodations and resources for students and making the processing job quicker. We also followed up on our disabilities definition bill. Hopefully you will get that by the end of this month. We also followed up on our Open discussion forum. There has been a few other open discussion forums/ meetings with the multicultural organizations. We also talked about the native language courses, so we will follow up on that and then the Women's history month resolution bill and that is basically it.
- **Sustainability:** Susty met officially this past Sunday, despite our members being delirious and near-death from the spring forward time change. We introduced our project tracking board on Trello, reviewed our current projects, and brainstormed potential legislation for said projects as well as some standalone legislation. Susty will not be meeting this upcoming Sunday, March 16th, and will be meeting unofficially on Sunday, March 23rd. As a reminder, the Susty trash walk will be on March 30th at 2:30pm.
- **University Policy:** Upol met officially this weekend we had a very lengthy discussion about our meal swipes project. Vice Chair Hallum did some work to compile a list of the meal swipe prices at some of our peer SEC schools. If any of you guys would like to see that reach out to me, reach out to him we can get you that. We are going to take a look at it a bit further. Now that the Board of Regents is looking to increase the price of our meal swipe and our meal plans and our housing plans. So we are going to look at that and see if it changes anything compared to our peer SEC schools, wait and see if there are any changes from those as well to see if we need to adjust our approach. As of right now we will not be pursuing any different approach based on that change though. We are also going to be having a meeting at least Representative Vedra will have a meeting this week with David Ebert our Chief AI officer who agreed to have a meeting this week. Just about the use of AI at the university and will be working on a fair use policy for AI. Other than that our survey for student wages is live, it will be sent out in a mass email tomorrow. If any of you are in

some large survey classes, like 300-400 people I am going to be reaching out to professors to see if they will show that for about 10-15 seconds. So you guys will probably also see a QR code for that in any of those large classes if you have any of those. Other than that I am not sure that I have anything else.

- **Ways and Means:** Hey everyone! WAM did not meet this week as a reward for their hard work on Primary. Thank you to the WAMily for spending long hours working to allocate funding to our Registered Student Organizations on campus! I'll be presenting both Primary bills this evening, so look forward to that!

- AB-113-01 "Primary Funding Act of 2025 for Governmental Organizations" (Schonfield) (Rec of Do-Pass)
- AB-113-02 "Primary Funding Act of 2025 for Registered Student

Authors Explanation:

Good evening, everyone as per usual I will keep this short and simple. This is primary, both bill there is the governmental and the RSO's. If you have any questions about allocations feel free to let me know. I will let you know that the SGA Budgetary Committee decided all of these across the span of 3 days so a lot of time has been poured into this and I am more than happy to answer any questions that you may have. I may be directing some questions to my Vice Chair because she has fiscal history pulled up but yeah.

- **Kathuria-** Why does CAC need \$165,212.65, what is that going to be used for?
 - CAC asked for \$172,200 as far as what that was allocated toward they got that money for the concert series, Homecoming, film series, speakers bureau, the union programming board and they requested money for welcome week and the committee did not fund it.
- **Kathuria-** Why did the budgetary committee not provide funding toward the CAC welcome week?
 - As with most applications they are asked to rank well I say most every application is asked to rank what their top priority versus their lowest priority. In this case welcome week was at the bottom of their list and I also think that the amount that they were asking for was part of that decision as well.
- **Hawley-** Is there a reason that men's rugby has such a high amount compared to the other sports?
 - **Duncan-** We look at fiscal history the most and last year they fully spent the \$7,538.96 they received and that is what primarily goes into consideration that is why they got more than all the other sports organizations because of their fiscal history?

- **Vedra-** Is this funding given to them proportional to the number of members that they demonstrate?
 - Yeah, that is definitely one of the factors that the committee likes to take into account. One of the most important things like Elizabeth said is fiscal history, but another big important factor is how many people are getting to go to these events that different organizations are hosting, basically what is the impact that they are having on campus so one of these metrics are how many people are going to events, how many people are considered members that sort of thing.
- **Hallum-** Why do you use fiscal history as opposed to anything else.
 - The reason why we use fiscal history as an important factor is because the student activity fee is what gives us these funds. So every single student that goes OU, here at the Norman campus is paying student activity fee in relation to the number of hours they they are paying for so it is our goal to be stewards of these funds and make sure that the people we are giving these funds too are being good stewards as well. If we give funds to an organization that does not use those funds then everyone that paid a student activity fee that year is no longer getting the benefit for the money that they paid into the system so if we give money to someone that cannot spend that money or has proven that they won't spend the money that's kind of just us telling people that they shouldn't get to benefit from the funds that they are paying
- **Cunningham-** On a scale of 1-10 how much bias went into these decisions?
 - On a scale of 1-10 I am going to say 1 assuming that is the lowest number on the scale I will point off that it is humans making the decisions and with any human system there is going to be some level of bias that is why I didn't say 0 I didn't take it off of the chart even though that was my first instinct. But yes as much as we can eliminate bias in the process the committee does strive to do that.
- **Vice Chair Gilson-Bond-** Do you have the number of how much funding was requested versus how much you were able to give?
 - **Schonfield-** I have a rough estimate in my head but I am going to direct that question to my Vice Chair as she has the exact number ready.
 - **Duncan-** The amount requested is 2 million roughly and what we have right here was primarily allocated was \$581,000 roughly and that is including the governmental organizations and the RSOs and that is not including salaries and stipends that we also include but that is roughly the numbers
 - **Schonfield-** To get extremely specific there was 2,008,227.29 requested and there was 581,276.74 to allocate in primary funding which is about 1/4 of the money requested was what we were able to give out.
- **Kathuria-** Could you explain to me why OU Hockey is not on the list?
 - If I recall I do not believe I received a request from the Hockey Club that is pretty much the only answer I have for you if someone did not get an application in before the deadline, despite all the times that the information was pushed out that's just kind of where things lie. I am also not familiar with whether or not they exist as an intermural club that we could give funding to.

- CB-113-20 "Expulsion Bill No.2" (Harris) (Rec of no Rec)

Authors Explanation:

This is an expulsion bill for Associate Awoyemi, he is a part of the WAM committee. He came to one general body meeting at the beginning of the session and then has not shown up to anything since or done his CSP. As Jacob reached out to him with no response on GroupMe and I reached out as well. In my email, I said that if he did not respond by last Tuesday the 4th, it would be cause for expulsion. He never responded or attended the Tuesday general body meeting so that is why we are seeing this bill.

- CB-113-21 “Outlining Congressional Impeachment Hearings.” (Martin) (Rec of Do Pass)

Authors Explanation:

Hey y’all so basically we are just outlining the impeachment process in our bylaws. Basically the Constitution allows us to conduct the process however we would like, but it is also outlined in the Code Annotated in Title II Chapter II Section IX, where it states that the legislative body has the right to impeach eligible people for impeachment and removal from executive, judicial, and programming branches. This has been a project that has been going on for a long time. I know that Maddy Cantrell as well as Ben have been working on this for quite a while. We were kind of in a hold up, we were waiting for General Council’s opinion. We finally got that opinion last week so we got this bill made, we went through ConAd we gave it a do pass and late Sunday night we got general counsel’s opinion on the bill and made updates to the bill and now this is what we have and we made sure that it is constitutional.

- **Wang-** What were the specific constitutional or legal concerns that the general council had with the original bill?
 - So the concern was to make sure that someone has there, in the Constitution we have a process where we have a right to do our impeachment process how we want. Also in the Constitution you have something called the Student’s Bill of Rights where it states that you have the right of due process and every right that you have at the University like a right to education, everything like is in the Student Bill of Rights, that was her concern, so we just made sure that we updated the bill to match the concerns of the general council.
- **Schonfield-** Would you be open to a friendly amendment in Section 1 adding the word “Act after the word “Hearings,” striking Section 3 following the word “Hearings” and replacing it with “Section One Any Congress member may write a resolution to impeach any member eligible for impeachment of the Executive, Judicial, or Programming Branches. This resolution must outline the impeachment charges as well as any witnesses who are willing to speak during the hearing or trial. Subsection A, an Impeachment Bill must be submitted six (6) days before the hearing. The Congress Chair shall have twenty-four (24) hours to notify the people subject to impeachment. Subsection B, the resolution must be seen in the Congressional Administration Committee. Subsection C, the resolution must be seen in the Executive Committee which consists of the Congress Chair, the Vice-Chair, the Secretary, and all Committee Chairs. Subsection D, the resolution must receive a recommendation of no recommendation in both committees to be seen in general body. Subsection E, if the resolution is to be seen in general body the impeached officer must be notified within an hour of the last recommendation. This notification will be given through the Congress Secretary and must include the day of the hearing as well as the charges brought against the

potential officer being impeached. Subsection F, the resolution will be seen in Special Orders of the upcoming Congress General Body meeting. Section 2, The charge(s) for impeachment shall be brought before the body by the author of the resolution immediately before the time for questions shall begin. Subsection A, there shall be ten (10) minutes of time for questions for the author of the resolution, followed by ten (10) minutes of time for questions for the officer being impeached. Both periods of questioning can be extended as with a normal piece of legislation. Subsection B, after time for questions has elapsed, Congress shall enter into debate. Any person in the room shall be permitted to speak. An author's summation shall be made by both the author of the resolution and the impeachable officer following debate. Subsection C, following time for questions, Congress shall motion to enter into a special executive session where the impeachable officer and the author of the resolution shall not be allowed in the room. Only members of the Undergraduate Student Congress and SGA Advisors shall be permitted to speak in Executive Session. Subsection D, following Executive Session, there shall be a five (5) minute recess during which impeachment charge(s) shall be finalized by the author of the resolution. This list will be read by the presiding officer. Each charge will be voted on individually, and each charge that receives a majority vote will be forwarded to the Graduate Student Senate."

- I do.
- **Kathuria-** The bill does say any congress member does that mean can it be an associate or does it have to be a representative?
 - A person who writes the bill for impeachment can be anyone in Congress so that would be associates and representatives.
- **Iglehart-** With the changes to this bill will these changes be shown to general council?
 - I can reach out to her again, but it has been dealt with.
- **Vedra-** Is the 24 hours in Section 1A from the submission of the impeachment?
 - Submission of impeachment, when it is submitted on Engage, the Congress Chair who has to approve the bill has to tell whoever is on that impeachment bill that they are on that bill.
- **Vedra-** Is that 24 hours from the submission to Engage or from the approvment by the Chair?
 - To Engage.
- **Robinson-** Does this require that it be seen in ConAd first and then the Executive Committee after receiving a recommendation or can they be seen on the same weekend?
 - It can be seen on the same weekend.
- **President Strickland-** Does the SGA Constitution outline what impeachment charges are?
 - We do not and it has never been like that.
- **President Stickland-** What is an impeachable charge?
 - That can be brought up in the bill. If y'all do not know this has happened before. There was a person who was arrested, people in Congress were concerned and they outlined a resolution about how that process would be done because at the time they also just like now did not have a process outlined. So they thought at the time it would be best to write a resolution about how that would be done. That resolution did fail.

On a motion to extend time for questions by 10 minutes Kathuria seconded by Keupen

- **Keupen-** How does this bill ensure due process for the accused when they are excluded from the executive session and given limited time to prepare a defense?

- Well the only people allowed in executive session is people in Congress and essential SGA advisors and also the person who brings this impeachment bill cannot be in executive session so the only people in executive session are the people discussing whether there is enough to go forward with a trial.
- **Hawley-** Can you just give me the reason why the author is also not allowed in the room?
 - To make it fair for due process. That was one of the main concerns with general council's opinion.
- **Robinson-** Are you aware that in the Oklahoma Open Meetings Act it says that executive session is permitted when discussing the hiring or firing of an officer as we have seen with our no confidence votes?
 - Yes.
- **Hallum-** Does Section 1D mean that if both committees give a recommendation of do pass, we don't see it in general body?
 - That is correct because that would show bias.
- **President Strickland-** I know that the Chief Justice is supposed to preside over impeachment hearings, how does the Chief Justice's role play into this?
 - **Chair Rhoads-** So how impeachment is currently outlined in our constitution in general is that the hearing would happen in Congress, but the actual over trial happens in the Senate so the Chief Justice presides over the one in Senate, we just hear the charges, decide if the charges are even worth anything before it gets sent to Senate.
- **Keupen-** Can you speak about what the purpose of the executive session is in the first place?
 - To make it outlined how this acts in the real world, in the real world we are kind of like the grand jury and in the grand jury they also go into their own little executive session. The executive session is just to have the opportunity for Congress to discuss privately if they were to go forward or not that is just why executive session is there.
- **Mirza-** Does Section 2B include non-congressman to speak in debate and what was the reasoning for that?
 - **Martin-** It is to allow for if there is any witnesses that are brought forward, people that are subject to impeachment they can talk it just allows for due process there where people can confront each other on things that they are saying and not allowing it to go unchecked.
 - **Chair Rhoads-** I would also like to state, I don't know if you guys remember when we saw the executive office of the President appointment, but anybody could really engage in debate as long as we say its ok so as long as I recognize you for debate you can speak in debate.
- **Election Commissioner Savage-** Have you had other opinions on this and could you maybe give us some names of those people?
 - I have talked to many people about this. I have excessively talked about this to the general council that is why we have so many changes to make sure that we are doing this right because the last thing we want to do is have this happen if at all and its unconstitutional you do not want that at all.

- **Kathuria-** Yesterday I met with the faculty senate to discuss having Universal TopHat as the universal clicker system at the University of Oklahoma because of concerns about course material, course costs, and redundancy. AS INTRODUCED

An act relating to appropriations; providing for short title; stating purpose; appropriating Primary Funding for the 2025-2026 process; stating appropriation guidelines; establishing expiration deadline; directing transfer of unused funds by deadline; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION:

Section 1: This act shall be known and may be cited as the “Primary Funding Act of 2025 for Governmental Organizations”

Section 2: PURPOSE. The purpose of this act is to appropriate the funds of the University of Oklahoma Student Government Association to the organizations mentioned within.

Section 3: APPROPRIATION. The following amounts are hereby allocated to

AS INTRODUCED

A Congressional Act of Procedure providing for
impeachment proceedings; providing short title; and
providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA STUDENT GOVERNMENT
ASSOCIATION UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT CONGRESS:

- Section 1:** Title: This act shall be known and may be cited as the “Outlining Congressional Impeachment Act.”
- Section 2:** Purpose: The purpose of this act shall be to set the rules for impeachment hearings held in the Undergraduate Student Congress.
- Section 3:** AMENDATORY: The Undergraduate Student Congress Bylaws Section 8 is amended as follows. New additions shall be denoted by an underline, and deletions shall be denoted by a ~~striketrough~~.

Section 8.5 Impeachment Hearings:

1. Any Congress member may write a resolution to impeach any member eligible for impeachment of the Executive, Judicial, or Programming Branches. This resolution must outline the impeachment charges as well as any witnesses who are willing to speak during the hearing or trial.
 - a. An Impeachment Bill must be submitted six (6) days before the hearing. The Congress Chair shall have twenty-four (24) hours to notify the people subject to impeachment.
 - b. The resolution must be seen in the Congressional Administration Committee.
 - c. The resolution must be seen in the Executive Committee which consists of the Congress Chair, the Vice-Chair, the Secretary, and all Committee Chairs.
 - d. The resolution must receive a recommendation of no recommendation in both committees to be seen in general body.
 - e. If the resolution is to be seen in general body the impeached officer must be notified within an hour of the last recommendation. This notification will be given through the Congress Secretary and must include the day of the hearing as well as the charges brought against the potential officer being impeached.
 - f. The resolution will be seen in Special Orders of the upcoming Congress General Body meeting.
2. The charge(s) for impeachment shall be brought before the body by the author of the resolution immediately before the time for questions shall begin.
 - a. There shall be ten (10) minutes of time for questions for the author of the resolution, followed by ten (10) minutes of time for questions for the officer being impeached. Both periods of questioning can be extended as with a normal piece of legislation.

- b. After time for questions has elapsed, Congress shall enter into debate. Any person in the room shall be permitted to speak. An author's summation shall be made by both the author of the resolution and the impeachable officer following debate.
- c. Following time for questions, Congress shall motion to enter into a special executive session where the impeachable officer and the author of the resolution shall not be allowed in the room. Only members of the Undergraduate Student Congress and SGA Advisors shall be permitted to speak in Executive Session.
- d. Following Executive Session, there shall be a five (5) minute recess during which impeachment charge(s) shall be finalized by the author of the resolution. This list will be read by the presiding officer. Each charge will be voted on individually, and each charge that receives a majority vote will be forwarded to the Graduate Student Senate.

Section 4: This act shall become effective when passed in accordance with the SGA Constitution.
