o CR-114-05 "SGA Non-Partisanship Resolution of 2025" (Robinson) (Due Pass)

Author's Explanation

Chair Robinson: This piece of legislation has been in the works since the SEC exchange. Just to be clear this is just a resolution; this is not binding in any way. This is just a legal disclaimer. This is us committing to being a nonpartisan organization. We as student leaders of course have our own personal ideological preferences. Those are not going to impact our job, they're not going to impact the election cycle, who we endorse or how we run. These are thing we do in our personal lives but not implementing onto our students. We as student leaders are representing all students. We have a pretty diverse makeup of students politically. Within this past of campus, there are good chunks of students who are conservative or liberal. This doesn't matter. So across the United States, we've seen a lot of people pushing to kind of politicize student government and to politicize higher education in general. And like I mentioned in committee when I brought up this bill, higher education is political, but not in this way. It's political to us because we need the funding. Beyond that, it's not something that we really need to be implementing our political devices to. We are here to represent students, not a political party, not an affiliation. This is our job. We don't have parties. You run as a student, you run under your college. You do not run with a party beside your name. You do not run for a party or for an organization. You're running as a student for students. I think we have some info about how Americans' trust in the higher education system is declining. People are starting to see it as somewhere they don't want their kids to go to because they see it as some sort of weird threshold where everybody is rubbing up against each other. So this is something we're trying to push down a little bit. This is kind of an initiative that began with the SEC exchange. So we just wanted to get this out ahead of time before the election season. I've tried to get as many of our student leaders to sign on as cosponsors just to indicate this isn't just something coming from our branch. This is something that's pretty widespread throughout SGA that we're all committing ourselves to.

CONGRESSIONAL BILL AB-114-03 SENATE BILL NO. GS25-XX

AS INTRODUCED

An act relating to appropriations; providing for short title; stating purpose; appropriating Auxiliary Funding for the 2025-2026 process; stating appropriation guidelines; establishing expiration deadline; directing transfer of unused funds by deadline; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION:

Section 1: This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Auxiliary Allocation 3 Act of 2025-2026"

Section 2: PURPOSE. The purpose of this act is to appropriate the funds of the University of Oklahoma Student Government Association to the organizations mentioned within.

AS INTRODUCED

A Congressional Resolution acknowledging the importance and recognition of Mental Health Week; and providing for distribution.

Whereas: Studies show that nearly 60% of college students experience overwhelming anxiety, with more than 40% reporting symptoms of depression that interfere with daily functioning¹; and

Research also reveals that suicide is the second leading cause of death among young adults,

highlighting the urgent need for proactive support2; and

Whereas: Mental health challenges directly affect academic performance, retention, and overall well-

being, demonstrating the far-reaching impact on both students and institutions³; and

Whereas: Acknowledging Mental Health Week provides an essential opportunity to raise awareness,

reduce stigma, and connect students to critical resources that foster resilience and success.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT CONGRESS, CONCURRING THEREIN THAT:

Section 1: Title: This resolution shall be known and may be cited as the "Mental Health Week Resolution of 2025."

Section 2: The University of Oklahoma Undergraduate Student Congress will recognize and celebrate the time spanning from October 6th through October 9th of 2025 as OU's first annual Mental Health Week, acknowledging the importance of breaking the stigma around mental

health and promoting self-help strategies and resources on campus.

Section 3: OU Undergraduate Student Congress encourages the student body to participate in events put on by the Secretary of Student Services, such as Yoga on the South Oval, Film Series,

Treat Yourself Tabling, a Resource & Consent Bar, and a Student-Led Mental Health

CONGRESSIONAL RESOLUTION CR-114-05 SENATE RESOLUTION NO. GF25-##

AS INTRODUCED

A Concurrent Resolution reaffirming the Student Government Association's commitment to nonpartisanship; and providing for distribution.

Whereas: For 56 years, the University of Oklahoma Student Association, now Student Government

Association, has stood as a representative body dedicated to the needs, interests, and welfare

of all students, irrespective of political beliefs.1

Whereas: The Student Government Association is tasked with serving the entire student body, not any

single party, ideology, or political faction.

Whereas: The Student Government Association's mission statement emphasizes a duty to "prioritize

student voices," to "advocate for the holistic development of each student," and to

"promote civic engagement and community involvement across campus."2

Whereas: The health and integrity of student governance as a concept relies on maintaining credibility

and fairness.

Whereas: Students should never feel unwelcome, silenced, or disadvantaged at the University of

Oklahoma due to their political affiliation, ideology, or lack thereof.

Whereas: Partisan alignment, political branding, and ideological signaling within the Student

Government Association undermine our credibility and compromise our primary obligation

to equitably prioritize student voices.

Whereas: Instances of overt political orientation and motivations within the Student Government

Association risk turning the organization into one with de facto party affiliations and detract

from our mission to enhance the student experience.

Whereas: The governing documents of the Student Government Association were never designed to

accommodate or favor partisan governance.

Whereas: The presence of partisan influence in the Student Government Association threatens to

alienate significant segments of the student body and discourage participation from those

who feel marginalized or misrepresented.

Whereas: 32% of Americans have little or no confidence in higher education, with 41% of Americans

with little confidence in higher education believing it is a result of political agendas and 37%

believing that higher education does not focus on the correct issues.³

Whereas: 68% of Americans believe higher education is headed in the wrong direction.³

Whereas: The Student Government Association recognizes that these growing negative opinions of

higher education are a result of perceived partisanship within these institutions.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT CONGRESS AND THE GRADUATE STUDENT SENATE, CONCURRING THEREIN THAT:

Section 1: Title: This resolution shall be known and may be cited as the "SGA Non-Partisanship Resolution of 2025."

Section 2: The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association unequivocally condemns all forms of partisanship, political branding, and ideological alignment within the operations, elections, and appointments of the Student Government Association.

Section 3: All elected or appointed members of the Student Government Association are called to maintain organizational integrity by refraining from partisan language, campaign materials, or conduct that implies affiliation with or favoritism toward any political party, ideology, or faction when actively serving in meetings, campaigns, or other official capacities.

Section 4: The Student Government Association shall take steps to review our governing documents, campaign procedures, and internal practices to ensure mechanisms are in place to guard against partisan influence and reinforce our nonpartisan mission.

CONGRESSIONAL BILL CB-114-11

AS INTRODUCED

A Congressional Act of Procedure to update the Campus Outreach, Safety, and Concerns Committee purpose statement; providing short title; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT CONGRESS:

Section 1: Title: This act shall be known and may be cited as the "COSCO Purpose Statement Update Act."

Section 2: Purpose: The purpose of this act shall be to update the Campus Outreach, Safety, and Concerns Committee's purpose statement to better reflect the current mission and actions of the committee.

Section 3: AMENDATORY: The University of Oklahoma Undergraduate Student Congress Bylaws Section 6.1is amended as follows. For the purposes of this bill, all items removed shall be denoted with a strikethrough (strikethrough) and all items added shall be denoted with an underline (underline).

Section 6.1: STANDING COMMITTEE ESTABLISHMENT

CAMPUS OUTREACH, SAFETY, AND CONCERNS

COMMITTEE PURPOSE The Campus Outreach, Safety, and Concerns Committee shall use the Student Congress's resources to resolve all concerns regarding university infrastructure, student experience, and all other student concerns that the committee mandates itself to address. The Campus Outreach Safety and Concerns Committee must plan a light walk each month congress has a general body meeting and classes are held on campus. The Campus Outreach Safety and Concerns (COSCO) Committee works through Student Congress to enhance student life by addressing campus and university infrastructure concerns, conducting student body outreach, and promoting campus safety initiatives, such as a regular light walk.

COMMITTEE CHAIR The Committee Chair shall be charged with maintaining and following up with the Undergraduate Student Congress Campus Concern Link submissions. The Committee Chair shall coordinate with the Congress Chair to refer Campus Concern Link submissions to other committees, should they more appropriately fall under another committee's responsibilities. The Committee Chair shall work with the Chief of the OU Police Department to ensure safety hazards on campus are addressed by the appropriate authorities. The Committee Chair shall report any potential safety hazards to the Chief of the OU Police Department to ensure the department is aware and can develop an appropriate response.

Section 4:	This act shall become effective when passed in accordance with the SGA Constitution.

CONGRESSIONAL BILL CB-114-12

AS INTRODUCED

A Congressional Act of Procedure expelling a Representative from the Congressional Body; providing short title; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT CONGRESS:

Section 1: Title: This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Session 114 Expulsion Bill No. 1."

Section 2:	Purpose: The purpose of this act shall be to expel a member for excessive unexcused absences. Jael Finley has accrued excessive unexcused absences, the membership of the aforementioned is pending expulsion.
Section 3:	In accordance with Section 3.4, subsection 2, subsection e of the SGA Undergraduate Student Congress Bylaws, "Upon accruing a fourth absence, the Student Congress Secretary shall prepare an act of procedure to expel any member or committee officer who has accrued excessive unexcused absences."
