Officer Reports -

- Chair's Report: Hi, everyone. This has been an incredibly tense election cycle for all three tickets, and now especially for two tickets. There has been a lot of hyperbolic language being thrown around by both sides, and I speak on behalf of everyone up here and all of our leaders when I say it needs to stop ASAP. You are welcome to support your candidate, advocate for their policies, and be willing to report when you see something wrong. What is important for us all to recognize is that we have a duly appointed commission and commissioner to handle these jobs. Commissioner Savage and his staff all came before this body, were approved by this body and our counterparts. These are not mystery administrative state people who are granted these powers. We took the time to vet and approve them, and it is often a job that goes thankless. We have a duty to uphold the image of this organization and the perception of our elections. When members of the student body hear things that undercut the integrity of our elections, it bodes poorly for us. Everyone has their own opinions on this race, and I am no exception, but it is critical for us to support those around us and those who are tasked with managing these elections. As a reminder for you all, last year we approved an amendment to Title III of our Bylaws outlining disciplinary action for misconduct by members of this body and I highly encourage you all to go review this once again. There has been a noticeable toxicity in this organization as a whole, and quite frankly among the student body, since the election started and it needs to stop now. We are all adults, whether you perceive yourselves to be or not.
- Vice Chair's Report: Good Evening,

SUSTY won the CSP competition with an impressive average of 1.55 CSPs per member; congratulations to Da'Juan Hawkins and Sam Bregnard for being recognized as Congress Members of the Month! Regarding elections; as many of you have heard, it's important to separate the individual from their platform. Critiquing someone's ideas is fair, but being disrespectful toward a person is not. Frankly, I'm tired of hearing about this issue. If you're in the Conoco spaces making demeaning or inappropriate remarks about candidates as individuals, misconduct points may be assigned, which can be used as grounds for removal if behavior as such persists. It's perfectly fine to disagree; but let's disagree respectfully and act like adults.

CONGRESSIONAL BILL CB-114-15

AS INTRODUCED

An Act of Procedure authorizing a survey of the student body on behalf of the Undergraduate Student Congress; providing for short title, providing for codification, and providing for an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION:

- **Section 1**: Title: This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Class Attendance Format Survey Act of 2025."
- Section 2: Purpose: The purpose of this act shall be to establish a survey as the Undergraduate Student Congress. The SGA Undergraduate Congress shall survey undergraduate students to determine what attendance format professors use in their classes.
- **Section 3**: The following questions shall be administered via Qualtrics.

Introduction:

Thank you for considering participation in our important survey. The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association Undergraduate Congress is gathering data about the way attendance is taken on campus to streamline the process and reduce costs for students. For your information: TopHat is available to students for free, while iClicker requires students to pay at least \$15.99. There is room for 6 class entries in the survey. If you have less classes than 6, please answer "None" to the rest of the questions after you enter your classes attendance formats.



SENATE RESOLUTION NO. GFXX-XX

AS INTRODUCED

A Concurrent Resolution acknowledging the month of November as Native American Heritage Month; and providing for distribution.

Whereas: Native American Heritage Month is celebrated during the month of November; and

Whereas: Native American Heritage Month is used to promote and celebrate the cultural identities of

Native Americans and Alaskan Natives; and

Whereas: Native American Heritage Month is also used to educate the public on the challenges Native

Tribes and people have faced throughout America's history; and

Whereas: The United States federal government first recognized Native American Heritage Month in

19901; and

Whereas: Today about 7.4 million people are registered as Native American or Alaskan Native in the

United States2; and

Whereas: In 2023, about 6.79% of the population in Oklahoma were Native American, which equals

to 271 thousand people3; and

Whereas: As of 2023 at the University of Oklahoma there were 1,107 or 3.8% students who were

registered as Native American4; and

Whereas: The University of Oklahoma resides on the traditional homeland of the Caddo and Wichita

nations. As well as being a part of the Apache, Comanche, Kiowa, and Osage nations⁵; and

Whereas: Suppression, assimilation, and removal of Native Peoples and their culture were official

policies by early state and federal settlement laws6; therefore

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT CONGRESS AND THE GRADUATE STUDENT SENATE, CONCURRING THEREIN THAT

Section 1: Title: This resolution shall be known and may be cited as the "Native American Heritage

Month Resolution of 2025."

Section 2: The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association shall recognize the month of

November as Native American Heritage Month.

Section 3: The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association shall recognize and honor

the Native American students at The University of Oklahoma in addition to their culture and

heritage.

Section 4: The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association shall recognize and honor

the University of Oklahoma resides on traditional Native American land.

Section 5: The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association encourages the student body

to participate in cultural appreciation events such as those planned by the American Indian

Student Association in collaboration with other Native American and Alaskan Native Student Organizations on campus.
