o CR-114-03 "Oversight and Transparency in AI Usage Act" (Vedra) (Due Pass)

Author's Explanation:

Representative Vedra: Hi everyone, I'm glad to be here tonight, and I'm glad to finally be seeing some legislation on this. The main purpose of this resolution is to clarify our position as a body amd specifically call for a general oversight council on AI. The impetus for this was the closing of the Crimson Call Center over the summer. It's something that kind of flew under our radar because most of us were not here. It's important to take a moment to specifically highlight our job in representing student employees, as well as their impact on this campus. Our condemnation of the fact that those roles that they filled were taken by an AI chatbot. The other thing this does is it recognizes the AI working group's call for a permanent advisory council that would advise upper administration, specifically on the role of ethical use of AI in this institution. I just wanted to reiterate that point and add our weight to it.

round number, I believe it was \$300 that we got them to, after we added the \$17.67. We just wanted there to be a round number at the end.

CONGRESSIONAL RESOLUTION CR-114-03

AS INTRODUCED

A Congressional Resolution urging greater oversight and transparency regarding AI Usage and its impact on students and providing for distribution.

Whereas: The mission of the University of Oklahoma Student Government Association

Undergraduate Student Congress is to represent the interests of undergraduate students in

their pursuit of academic and individual achievement¹; and

Whereas: On June 21, 2025, the OU Foundation shut down the Crimson Callers, a group which

facilitated donation to the university2; and

Whereas: As many as 40 student employees lost their jobs; and

Whereas: The function of the Crimson Callers has since been assumed by an AI chatbot³; and

Whereas: Student employment is integral to many as they work to achieve their degree; and

Whereas: Student employees are integral to the functions and the services of this university; and

Whereas: The University of Oklahoma does not currently have a permanent body addressing the

ethical and moral implications on the use of AI; and

Whereas: The AI Governance Working Group has recommended a permanent Advisory Council that

advises and reports to those responsible for AI Governance at OU (i.e., the Chief AI

Officer, Provost, etc.)4.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT CONGRESS THAT:

Section 1: Title: This resolution shall be known and may be cited as the "Oversight and Transparency in AI Usage Act".

Section 2: The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association recognizes the possibilities of Artificial intelligence and Machine Learning to be tools, and a boon to the education of University of Oklahoma Students.

Section 3: The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association also recognizes the lack of a permanent oversight body regulating the impact on students' lives and educations by Artificial Intelligence usage by the University of Oklahoma and university-affiliated groups.

Section 4: The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association condemns, in the strongest possible terms, the removal of student jobs in favor of their replacement with Artificial Intelligence-based tools.

Section 5: The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association calls for a permanent regulatory body to be formed regarding Artificial intelligence for the benefit of students' work and education.

Section 6: The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association calls for greater notice and transparency from the University of Oklahoma Administration, and from the OU Foundation regarding changes impacting student employees.

CONGRESSIONAL BILL AB-114-02 SENATE BILL NO. GS25-XX

AS INTRODUCED

An act relating to appropriations; providing for short title; stating purpose; appropriating Auxiliary Funding for the 2025-2026 process; stating appropriation guidelines; establishing expiration deadline; directing transfer of unused funds by deadline; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION:

Section 1: This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Auxiliary Allocation 2 Act of 2025-2026"

Section 2: PURPOSE. The purpose of this act is to appropriate the funds of the University of Oklahoma

Student Government Association to the organizations mentioned within.
