- CB-115-10 "Budgetary Committee Composition Act of 2026" (Schonfield/Jensen) (Due Pass)

### **Author's Explanation:**

**Senator Jensen:** Hello, everyone. So Jacob and I wrote this bill. It's a relatively simple bill. Its purpose is just to add a few individual positions to the SGA budgetary committee. Essentially what this would do is it would give these positions an opportunity to make contributions towards grading auxiliary and primary funding and allocating money throughout SGA. It's important to note that these people would not be required to attend these meetings, but it would give them the opportunity to contribute if necessary.

**Representative Schonfield:** Yeah. On that note, I just want to point out that whenever we're talking about each of these positions, the reason why we chose these individuals is primarily because they are the leadership for the other branches of SGA generally. So that's the SBA president, CAC chair, the SGA president, not SBA, and the Graduate Student Senate chair. We want to make sure that everyone across SGA generally has a seat at the table when it comes to allocating funds just because it makes it so that we're getting every point of view, every perspective. And I'll also point out that this would not lead to any sort of overthrow of WAM's power. We still have 20 people on the committee and opposition to, like, five. So even if these people wanted to go the opposite direction of what WAM wanted to, it wouldn't matter in the scheme of things. It's simply to make sure those voices are being heard, and we have everyone with a seat at the table.

- **Representative Savage:** Authors, when selecting a proxy, is there any requirements for it? Is it just totally up to their discretion who they choose?
  - **Representative Schonfield:** We decided to just leave it completely up to them, not even limiting it to, like, within their branch or anything like that because at the end of the day, these people are capable of choosing people to represent their interests and what they would want at the committee meetings. So, no, there are no restrictions. It's just anyone that they select as a proxy would be able to act as a as a member.
- **Representative Vedra:** Authors, section 3.7 C, that's the addition of travel as an expense category. Can you explain the reason for that change?
  - **Representative Schonfield:** So everything that was changed inside of this this section, this area is unrelated to, like, the meat and potatoes of what we're trying to do with the bill. That's just this was already something that was on the bill as far as, like, what I had to cite when writing the legislation. And so while we were there, I figured I would make things look the way that we actually do them already. So that's including travel as a section on the application that they can fill out as well as changing capital investments to expenses because

that's the way that we look for things. So that's not really changing anything about the way that anything is done. It's simply making it so that the CA reflects the reality of the situation.

- **Representative Bass:** Would you accept a friendly amendment adding me as a cosponsor?
  - **Representative Schonfield:** Yes.

- CB-115-11 “Crimson Leadership Association Revision Act of 2026” (Toyos-Perez) (Due Pass)

**Author’s Explanation:**

**Representative Toyos-Perez:** Hi, everyone. My name is Alex Toyos. I'll start by saying I'm in congress. I'm also the co-chair for CLA this semester. So this bill is just updating the code annotated to more updated practices and just language that we use now. For example, council was it used to be the Sooner Freshman Council and now association, so changes like that. But the main change to this is our office hour requirement from three to five hours. CLA is not paid for their office hours like other positions are, but it's essential to connecting with our members outside of our typical Monday night meetings the same way that other members of SGA are available to their members. For the last three years, it has been tradition to hold five hours instead of the mandated three, but I think it would set a good precedent to just go ahead and change that since we can and keep it at five hours.

- **Representative Savage:** Author, would you accept a friendly limit to add Election Commissioner and WAM Chair to possible and subject should be section one to possible ways to earn points through office hours?
  - **Representative Toyos-Perez:** Yes.
- **WAM Chair Schonfield:** Do you think increasing the number of office hours required opens the door to a stronger argument for the Co-Chairs here to be paid?
  - **Representative Toyos-Perez:** Yes, and it would be something I'd be open to discussing later since the finances would be would difficult to go through. Yes. But it's work that we have to do whether we get paid for it or not anyways. I volunteered for the position in April, and I've been doing the five hours. I often hold seven hours even if I'm not getting paid for it. So if in the future the finances of it become a problem, I can address it then.

- AB-115-01 “Auxiliary Allocation 4 Act of 2025-2026” (Schonfield) (Due Pass)

**Author’s Explanation:**

**WAM Chair Schonfield:** Hello, illustrious body. You guys have seen me present allocation bills before. This is another one of those. This is the last aux bill for this year. This allocates is the last of the funding that we have for aux. Just for anyone who may not be familiar, the way that we do aux, we get money from what doesn't get spent in the year previous, and then we allocate those funds to our RSOs who applied in the same order that they applied for the funds. This year, we we ran out, and we still had a handful of organizations who had applied but did not receive any funds because those funds were exhausted. If you have any questions about the bill, let me know.

- **Representative Savage:** Author, would you accept a friendly amendment to sort all these organization titles by the court?
  - **WAM Chair Schonfield:** Yes.
- **Representative Rhoads:** Would you mind explaining the difference between primary and auxiliary?

- **WAM Chair Schonfield:** Yeah. So as you guys know, primary funding applications are open. Like I said earlier, our meeting to discuss and and decide primary funding will happen on March. The funding for primary comes from the student activity fee directly. Student activity fee committee decides how much money we have to give to RSOs in primary, and then we give that out to everybody all in one big go. It's for the following academic year after your application. Whereas in aux, the money comes from reversions, like I mentioned, the money that doesn't get spent by RSOs in the year previous, and also aux is for the same year that you apply for it in. So people who have their applications being reviewed here gave their gave us their applications last semester before I closed the aux application window due to limited funds.
- **Representative Morgan:** Can you just start with some of the primary criteria for deciding who gets what I need?
  - **WAM Chair Schonfield:** Yeah. So as I've covered in our presentations to orientation and everything else, Essentially, the main criteria that we're using when reviewing applications are fiscal history, scope of the organization, impact. There's five main metrics. fiscal history is the most important because we want to make sure that you guys and or your RSOs are spending the funds that they're allocated to benefit the students who are paying that student activity fee. And we're also looking at number of members impact on on campus scope and just generally how unique the organization is and what it does for the student body.
- **Chief of Staff Christiansen:** The last aux bill was passed in October. Were these funds that were still available from then, or are these new funds?
  - **WAM Chair Schonfield:** So the money that was allocated in this aux bill is the funds that were left essentially on the table by the retirement of a full time staff member in the SGA office. So Kurt, our financial guy, essentially, in SGA, he retired during the summer. So the funds that we were allocating this year were coming from what he would have been getting paid. So the time that has elapsed since the last aux bill has just been essentially what built up the money that got allocated here, if that makes sense.
- **Representative Hawkins:** Can you give me a refresher on how you collect data for your decisions?
  - **WAM Chair Schonfield:** In an application, essentially, the organizations give background information about the organization. They give us information about whether or not they've had changes in exec or other difficulties in past years that may affect their fiscal history, and then they give us the application for funds. The way that the application itself is laid out essentially is that you just have a series of different sections that you put line items that fit in the different sections asking for individual items. What the committee really wants to see is a lot of detail on those applications and, you know, proof that you have a plan for funding, not that you are asking for money simply because you know that you can ask for money if that addresses what you're yeah.
- **Representative Karrar:** When you're talking about the fiscal history, is that something reviewed yearly, or is that cumulative for the history of the RSO?
  - **WAM Chair Schonfield:** I look at the fiscal history of an organization. I go into Engage and look at the transactions that their organization has had on their Engage page, and I essentially look for times that there have been deposits into that account from SGA, and I look at when we had funds revert back to us for SGA. So we're trying to see how much of the funds that we're giving them are being reverted back to us versus how much of it was spent throughout the year. I'm also able to review, like, what those items were that they spent money on. So if I see someone spent money on something that was completely ridiculous, I can point it out and bring it up. So that essentially, I go and find that information each time that I get an application, and I put that into an Excel sheet that my committee has access to.
- **Representative Kurtz:** You said you review based on fiscal history. How do new organizations access funds?

- **WAM Chair Schonfield:** So whenever we have a new organization applying for funds, which is also a good question by the way, we start out each funding period with a discussion revolving around how much money we have and what we think is a fair number to start people out with. What we've done whenever we were especially thin on funding was start people out with \$500. And since this semester, at least, we made \$500 our baseline for new organizations just so that they have an opportunity to have some money that they can spend and prove that they spend that money to benefit the students. That's essentially how we start them up at that amount. And then as the years pass and they spend money that they get from us and they have proof of their impact on the campus, etcetera, they can see that number grow over time.

AS INTRODUCED

An Act of Legislation that changes the makeup of the  
SGA Budgetary Committee; providing short title; and  
providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA STUDENT GOVERNMENT  
ASSOCIATION UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT CONGRESS:

**Section 1:** Title: This act shall be known and may be cited as the “Budgetary Committee Composition Act of 2026,”

**Section 2:** Purpose: The purpose of this act shall be to additional members of Student Government to the SGA Budgetary Committee.

**Section 3:** AMENDATORY: The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association Code Annotated Title X Chapter 4 Section 7 is amended as follows. For the purposes of this bill, all items removed shall be denoted with a strikethrough (~~strikethrough~~) and all items added shall be denoted with an underline (underline).

7. **The SGA Budgetary Committee**

- a. **Membership.** The Undergraduate Student Congress Ways & Means Committee and one (1) member of the Graduate Student Senate Ways & Means Committee shall constitute a standing committee known as the SGA Budgetary Committee and shall be chaired by the Chair of the Undergraduate Student Congress Ways & Means Committee. The Graduate Student Senate Chair, Campus Activities Council Chair, SGA President, and Student Bar Association President, or their proxies, shall also serve as Ex-Officio members. The SGA Budgetary Committee shall evaluate budget requests from student organizations and make recommendations to the Undergraduate Student Congress and the Graduate Student Senate, allocating Student Activity Fee funds to meet those budget requests in accordance with the University of Oklahoma Board of Regents’ policy, University of Oklahoma policy, this Title, and the Budget Procedures Act.
- b. **Open Meeting Act.** Dates and locations of orientation sessions, interviews, and budget allocations must be public and posted in accordance with the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act. A copy of all agenda and subsequent minutes shall be submitted to the chairs of the Graduate Student Senate and the Undergraduate Student Congress. See also Sec. 9 of this Chapter.

c. **Allocation Categories.** Allocations to organizations shall be divided into ~~three~~ four categories: Office Expenses, Capital ~~Expenses Investments, and~~ Programs/Events/ Activities (P/E/A's), and Travel as defined in Title ~~XII~~, Chapter 2, of the SGA Code Annotated.

d. **Election Funding**

i. **SGA Election Staff.** The SGA Budgetary Committee shall allocate sufficient funds in each Administrative Appropriations Act to conduct two General Elections, two run-off elections and at least one special election, including the compensation of all eligible election staff members for each election and sufficient publicity for filing and voting.

e. **Records**

i. **Electronic Archives.** At the conclusion of the budgetary process, the SGA Budgetary Committee shall store all application and allocation information electronically and provide one copy to the Staff Assistant and one copy to the Student Affairs accountant.

ii. **Annual Report.** At the conclusion of the Primary Budget Process, the Chair of the SGA Budgetary Committee shall produce an annual budget report containing the timeline, allocations, and procedural information used for the most recent Primary Budget Process. This report shall be made public to all students at the University of Oklahoma and copies shall be sent to the Chair of Undergraduate Student Congress, Chair of Graduate Student Senate, Campus Activities Council Chair, President of

SGA, and the Student Affairs accountant.

**Section 4:** This act shall become effective when passed in accordance with the SGA Constitution.

AS INTRODUCED

An Act of Legislation to amend the SGA Code Annotated,  
providing for short title, providing for codification,  
and providing for an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA STUDENT GOVERNMENT  
ASSOCIATION:

**Section 1:** Title: This act shall be known and may be cited as the “Crimson Leadership Association Revision Act of 2026.”

**Section 2:** Purpose: The purpose of this act shall be to update Title III Chapter 5 of the Code Annotated to reflect necessary changes to the operations of the Crimson Leadership Association.

**Section 3:** AMENDATORY: The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association Code Annotated Title VI is amended as follows. For the purposes of this bill, all items removed shall be denoted with a ~~striketrough~~. All items added shall be denoted with an underline.

Chapter 5- Crimson Leadership Association

1. Purpose. The SGA Crimson Leadership Association shall prepare its members for future involvement within the various branches of the SGA. The Crimson Leadership Association will also promote the programs and positions of, raise awareness and understanding of, and advocate for first year student involvement within the SGA as a whole, as well as other student organizations on the OU campus.
2. Members
  - a. Eligibility. Full time, first year students, in good academic standing with the University shall be eligible to submit applications for membership. Applicants must also complete an interview with the Crimson Leadership Association Co-Chairs. ~~Applications~~ Applicants chosen for membership must remain in good academic standing throughout their membership.
  - b. Responsibilities
    - i. Crimson Leadership Association Members shall obtain twenty (20) points each full semester, under the Crimson Leadership Association Point System. Points can be obtained through

attending office hours of any of the following SGA positions: SGA President, SGA Vice President, Chief of Staff, Undergraduate Student Congress Chair, Undergraduate Student Congress Vice Chair, Undergraduate Student Congress Secretary, Undergraduate Student Congress Committee Chairs, CAC Chair, CAC Event Chairs, and CAC Vice Chair on the Executive Council of CAC, and Crimson Leadership Association Co-Chairs. Additionally, points can be obtained by attending CAC events, SGA or CAC weekly meetings, or additional meetings outside the designated weekly meeting times under the discretion of the Co-Chairs.

- ii. Failure to obtain twenty (20) points by ~~means of~~ the means of the opportunities outlined above will result in a meeting with the Co-Chairs to discuss whether or not they will continue as a member of the Crimson Leadership Association.
3. Officers. There shall be two Co-Chairs of the ~~council~~ association charged with overseeing the delegation and reporting to the SGA Vice President.
    - a. Eligibility. Crimson Leadership Association members from the previous year, who have remained in good academic standing with the university, are eligible for nomination to a Co-Chair position.
    - b. Selection. Applicants must complete an interview with a board comprised of the SGA Vice President and previous year's Co-Chairs. The board shall then select the candidates with the advice and consent of the SGA President and the Legislative Branch. ~~The Co-Chair position shall be appointed by a board comprised of the SGA President, SGA Vice President, and previous year's Co-Chairs, with advice and consent of the Legislative Branch.~~
    - c. Term Length and Limit. The Co-Chair is appointed for one academic year beginning with their legislative confirmation. Officers may serve no more than one academic year. Officers appointed to fill a vacancy shall serve to the end of the academic year in which they were confirmed by the Legislative Branch.
    - d. Responsibilities
      - i. Co-Chairs shall review all applications and hold interviews in the fall semester to select Crimson Leadership Association membership for the upcoming school year. Member acceptance and application process is at the Co-Chair's discretion.
      - ii. Each ~~Each~~ Co-Chairs shall hold a minimum of ~~three (3)~~ five (5) office hours a week between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, in the SGA office. The office hours schedule shall be publicly posted.
      - iii. Co-Chairs shall determine the mechanism for ensuring members fulfill their responsibilities outlined in Section 27, subsection b.
      - iv. Co-Chairs will work closely with SGA Vice President as well as all branches of SGA, as necessary, to ensure the purpose of the Crimson Leadership Association is carried out.
      - v. Co-Chairs will share all responsibilities and must report to each other.
    - e. Vacancies. In the event of a vacancy, the responsibilities of the vacated seat shall fall upon the remaining officer, with the support of the SGA Vice President, until a suitable replacement has been appointed and confirmed by the legislature. In the event of both positions being vacated

the SGA Vice President will serve as sole Chair of Crimson Leadership Association until suitable replacement has been appointed and confirmed by the legislature.

- f. Officer Removal. The SGA Vice President shall have the authority to remove Co-Chairs with the advice and consent of the Legislative Branch.
  
- 4. Internal Proceedings. The SGA Crimson Leadership Association shall establish rules of procedure for the internal operations for the organization. These rules shall be published and available to students upon request. Any proposed and adopted rule changes must be sent to the SGA Vice President and appropriately distributed.
  
- 5. Meetings
  - a. Meeting Times. Co-Chairs shall establish meeting times for the full academic year by the third academic week of the fall semester.
  
  - b. Attendance. Each member is allowed two (2) unexcused absences per semester, after which they will need to meet with the Co-Chairs to discuss whether or not they will continue on as an Crimson Leadership Association member. A request for an excused absence must be submitted to the Co-Chairs in writing 24 hours before a meeting in order to be considered. What qualifies as an “excused” absence is at the discretion of the Co-Chairs.
  
- 6. Funding. The SGA Crimson Leadership Association shall be provided financial support through primary and auxiliary funding.
  
- 7. Report. ~~At least one of the Co-Chairs shall present a report of the Crimson Leadership Association’s progress and goals during a meeting with the SGA Vice President at least once per month. Each Co-Chair shall remain in formal communications with the SGA Vice President at least twice per month to update on the progress and goals of the Crimson Leadership Association, as well as their own individual performance.~~

**Section 4:** This act shall become effective when passed in accordance with the SGA Constitution.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION:

**Section 1:** This act shall be known and may be cited as the “Auxiliary Allocation 4 Act of 2025-2026”

**Section 2:** PURPOSE. The purpose of this act is to appropriate the funds of the University of Oklahoma Student Government Association to the organizations mentioned within.
