
OUR COMMUNITY

IFC COMMUNITY VALUES




LEADERSHIP

SERVICE

All IFC chapters have national and local philanthropic organizations they support. Whether through service or fundraising, IFC provides members a chance to give back to their community.



SCHOLARSHIP

IFC members are students first. Every academic college is represented in IFC's membership and the Spring 2025 All-IFC GPA was a 3.25. Many chapters offer scholarships and academic support for members.



BROTHERHOOD

Community and friendship are central to the IFC experience. Students can find brotherhood in their own chapter and the IFC community. These friendships last long after college.

FORMAL RECRUITMENT

MANDATORY ORIENTATION

OVERVIEW

To join IFC in the fall, students must attend orientation from 9:30 AM - 11:30 AM at the Jim Thorpe Multicultural Center. Students will have their first small group meeting directly following this orientation.

Students will visit 9 chapters in either North or South Greek between 2:00 - 7:00 PM. Groups are led by recruitment guides (Tau Gammas).

- Students participating in Formal Recruitment are required to attend a mandatory orientation at the Jim Thorpe Multicultural Center on August 20th at 9:30 AM

- Bids will be sent out to students at 1:00 PM and they will have until 10:00 PM to sign
- Students signing a membership bid should attend the Class Kickoff Event at the Gaylord Family Memorial Stadium
 - PC pictures and bid signing will happen on the field right after Class Kickoff!



- The fraternity recruitment process is loosely structured, allowing students to get to know each other in ways that make sense for them.
- Students are able to receive multiple bids but can only join one organization.
- Your students can attend fraternity hosted events before formal recruitment begins

- Don't sell yourself short take advantage opportunities and invitations from chapters.
- Get to know the people in your group it's a great way to make friends!

SUPPORTING YOUR STUDENT

LISTEN

Listening to your student's frustrations is the best way to support them. It's great to ask if they are calling or texting just to vent or if they want advice. It's a lot right at the beginning of their OU experience and they might just need to vent.

UNDERSTAND IT'S THEIR EXPERIENCE

The fraternity recruitment process is a great low-risk time for them to learn and practice decision-making. Allowing them the space to make those decisions will help them grow and develop.

BE INTENTIONAL

Being intentional in conversations with your student is so important. Try to let them come to decisions on their own and trust that you've given them the tools they need to make the tough choices.



HAZING PREVENTION

STUDENT SAFETY AND CARE
OU.EDU/STOP-HAZING

- OU is an anti-hazing institution
- Oklahoma state law prohibits any kind of hazing activity
- Hazing is against the student code of conduct
- Hazing training and education

- Alcohol is prohibited during any fraternity or sorority recruitment or new member experience
- Alcohol and other drug training and education
- Organizational strike process
