Letter of Intent to Establish Eligibility for In-state Status for Tuition Purposes

The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education establishes guidelines and regulations for in-state tuition classification for tuition purposes. Students are required to submit a letter of intent and reside in the state of Oklahoma while enrolling in the institution. This statement may serve as the letter of intent when completed and returned to the Office of Admissions and Recruitment or Veteran Student Services.

Chapter 35 Survivors’ and Dependents’ Educational Assistance – Certificate of Eligibility.
